LIFE SAVING AND PATROLS

Nine patrols were formed this season, initially with six or seven members. Subsequently as the number of active members increased with new members gaining awards, patrol strengths reached as high as 12 at the end of the season. Patrol captains were Don Burke, Peter Burke, Ron Burke, Rick Dzopalic, Dave O'Grady, Peter LeBreton, Jeff Lucke, Mark Thompson and Mark Wallace

73 members presented themselves for the annual proficiency test, with only one member failing to pass.

Stanwell Park beach was patrolled on 40 Sundays and public holidays between 24 September 1989 and 25 April 1990, with two patrols each day. Patrols were also in attendance on Saturdays from 5 November 1989 until 31 March 1990.

57 persons were rescued during the season, with the I.R.B. involved in 15 rescues. 12 persons were rescued with the aid of a rescue tube, 10 effected with a rescue board, and 20 without the aid of any gear.

Preventative action was taken and approximately 500 people encouraged to swim within the flags.

There were 121 cases of first aid recorded.

CLUB EQUIPMENT

The Club's rescue equipment consists of the following major items -

- * Two fully equipped I.R.Bs., one rescue mat, and three motors.
- * Three rescue boards, three surf reels, four rescue tubes.
- * Two oxy vivas.

Competitive equipment consists of two double skis, one single ski, and two oared surf boats, "Con Asmussen" and "Roger Williamson, OAM"

New equipment acquired during the year included an IRB with rescue mat, one IRB motor, one rescue board, two rescue tubes, plus one set of oars for the Roger Williamson surf boat.

One IRB and motor were sold during the year.

I.R.B. CAPTAINS REPORT

Another season has passed and running the I.R.B. is not becoming any easier. I hope that with the new I.R.B. all members will remember that it is equipment owned by the Club, and not I.R.B. drivers only.

It is important that all our members regard the I.R.B. operation as an integral part of our patrol and rescue work, and become involved in the day to day operation, care and maintenance of the craft and motors.

During the season, one of our long serving members finally gained his I.R.B. Drivers award. The season also saw our first female I.R.B. Driver, hopefully not the last.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank my Vice Captain for a number of years, Mark Wallace, who has indicated that he intends to stand down this year.

TEAM MANAGER'S REPORT

The 1989/90 competitive season has been one of the most interesting and successful ones in recent years for our Club. There have been a number of reasons for this. Most importantly, the larger number of competitors has brought a feeling of comradeship and 'club spirit' that has made me proud to belong to this Club. The success of the Junior (Seagulls) section of the Club over the last few years has flowed into the seniors. Other contributing factors have been the resurrection of a boat crew, an increasing number of women competitors, the willingness of people to act as coaches, such as Bill Buckley, Mark Alvos and Roger Hendry, and the enthusiasm of the Burke boys in all aspects of Club activities.

Our most outstanding competitor this season has been Don Burke who gained the highest points in carnivals. He has been rewarded for his dedication to training and competition, in spite of adverse weather, and his general enthusiasm which has passed onto all members of the Club.

Andrew Bedwell gained the second highest number of carnival points. He was voted the most improved competitor and we are expecting big things in the next season from him, and all our beach competitors under the watchful eye of 'Super Coach' Bill Buckley.

Illawarra Branch Championships

Andrew Bedwell topped a long list of successful competitors at the Branch titles held at Stanwell Park beach this year. He won the gold medal in the U/18 Beach Sprint and combined with Steven House, Greg and Mark McCarthy to win gold in the U/18 Beach Relay. This team performed well in most carnivals held this season.

Don Burke also did well by winning silver medals in the Open Beach Sprint, Open Flags, and in the Open Beach Relay when joining with his brother Ron, Matt Larkin and Mark Warncken. Ron Burke gained a bronze medal in the Open Flags.

It was pleasing to see Will Phillips returning to the competition trail with a bronze medal in the Veteran Surf. Also winning a bronze medal was the Open 6-man R&R team. Led by their coach Mark Alvos, Greg Gaffney, Don Harris, Steven McDonald, James and Jason Powell did exceptionally well for their first year together. Mark's experience and leadership proved to be invaluable.

Another newly formed team was the U/18 Boat Crew, consisting of Todd Hendry, Shane Keyes, Evan O'Toole and Adam Prentice, who gave their best in a difficult surf.

The increase in numbers in the U/15 age group was noticeable and many of them gained medals or were finalists. Karl Herrmann showed his versatility by gaining a silver medal in the U/15 Flags and bronze in the U/15 Board Riding. Both Simon Harris and Christine McDonald gained bronze medals in their respective U/15 Flag events. Wayne Dreghorn was there as usual, giving of his best in all events and teamed up with Simon Bedwell, Karl Herrmann and Matthew McDonald to take the bronze medal in the U/15 Beach Relay.

State Championships

Karl Herrmann gained a well earned bronze medal in the U/15 Board Riding event.

A number of other competitors reached finals or semi-finals in the State titles at Swansea-Belmont. Finalists were Don Burke, Andrew Bedwell, the Open Beach Relay team and U/18 Beach Relay team.

The rough water conditions played havoc on our swimmers, craft and board competitors.

All-States Masters Carnival

Will Phillips re-established his former strength in iron man competition by coming first in the All States Over 40 Iron Man Masters. His skill in handling ski, board and the surf was obvious and gave him a well deserved gold medal.

Australian Championships

After only two competitions in the season, the inexperienced U/18 Boat Crew reached the semi-finals. A big credit to them and their fearless sweep and coach Roger Hendry.

The U/18 Beach Relay team reached a pinnacle in their competition for the season by lining up for the finals.

Meikle Watt's skill and ability to handle a difficult surf enabled her to reach the finals in the Womens Board event.

Congratulations to all competitors and their supporters for a most successful season. This season not only produced winners in medals, but also winners in determination and enthusiasm as people like Damien Bowler, Meikle Watts, Wayne Dreghorn, Janine Powell and Christine McDonald who tried in all levels of competition. The increase in the number of female competitors has certainly given great support and interest to our boys.

CLUB ADMINISTRATION

Management Committee Meetings

The Management Committee met on eight occasions during the year. Attendance similar to previous seasons, averaged 11. Meetings were held on 29 August 1989 (10 Committee members attended), 19 September 1989 (9), 24 October 1989 (13), 28 November 1989 (13), 17 December 1989 (14), 21 January 1990 (8), 30 April 1990 (9) and 3 June 1990 (9 Committee members plus 7 other members)

Several of our older members have passed over to the Surf Club, items of memorabilia. This includes a Bronze Medallion gained by Harold Anger in 1925 and a Club jacket presented by the family of the late Clyde Budd.

Publicity

During the season, our Club gained positive publicity on the occasion of the 90th birthday of Life Member George Kinnell. 




FINANCE REPORT

For the first time since construction of the new building commenced some 11 years ago, the Club was able to finish the year with a healthy credit balance after making the final payment on a loan obtained for the construction of the new club house. This is the result of a concerted team effort to increase income through fund raising activities, and adopting a policy of acquiring new life saving equipment through sponsorship. Through monitoring of a budget, the Finance Committee also exerted pressure to control expenditure to within the bounds of available funds.

The sale of an I.R.B. and motor for \$2,900.00 and the depositing of the proceeds in a special emergency account in accordance with Club objectives set at the start of the season, has further assisted the Club's financial buoyancy.

The Finance Committee has met formally twice during the year on 8 October 1989 and on 25 March 1990. At both meetings, the Committee was able to review budgets and provide advice to the Management Committee on the Club's ability or otherwise to acquire additional items of equipment. Individual members of the Finance Committee also became involved in the organisation of specific fund raising activities.

The major fund raising activity was Life Savers Appeal Day, with \$4,000.00 being raised in a door-knock appeal which was co-ordinated by Paul Potter. Our previous best was \$2,200.00 collected about eight years ago. A target of \$3,000.00 was set this year, and it is a credit not only to the Club members who supported the day, but also the local community who supported our Club.

More than 45 members worked as collectors, in a well organised team.

A special thanks to Paul Potter for his efforts, and for his involvement in the organisation of our Christmas Raffle, the nett proceeds of which were \$850.00.

A further raffle run towards the end of the previous season, and early in the current season, and drawn at the Kembla Grange race meeting, resulted in proceeds of \$1900.00.

Various activities and social functions run by the Club including the Illawarra Branch Championships assisted in the overall fund raising effort.

As mentioned in earlier reports, the Sponsorship Committee has worked hard to obtain additional Club equipment, thus avoiding the need for the Club to expend funds.

The financial statements herein set out the Club's financial position as at the end of May 1990. Clearly the Club's expenses will continue to rise with the increased membership and the increased costs of operating two I.R.Bs. With direct costs involved in the running of the Club now exceeding \$30,000.00 per year, a formalised budget that relates expenditure to the Club's objectives and performance is essential if we are to keep our bank balances in the 'black'. This will be one item for discussion at the Club's forthcoming seminar.
