



MEMBERS

I submit herewith for your consideration and adoption the 84th Annual Report of the Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving Club.

In the previous years Annual Report, the opportunity was taken to reflect briefly on achievement of our objectives. Certainly the Club has achieved its most important objective of no lives lost this season and active membership has increased to possibly the highest ever. But the question must be asked whether we have simply met our objectives, or whether we have really achieved what we set out to do.

At the start of the 1989/90 season, i.e. two years ago, a number of objectives were set, like 100% pass rate for S.L.S.A. awards, 50% of active members I.R.B. drivers, 75% of active members A.R.C. holders, 75% of active members radio officers, and a greater number of members with 100% patrol attendance. All objectives aimed at improving the quality of life saving activities within the Club.

Whilst there have been a number of increases, we have failed to achieve one of our important objectives in terms of surf life saving - that of having as many members as possible trained to operate one of the best pieces of life saving equipment now available to us - the I.R.B.

As you peruse the reports from Club officers, you will note other areas in which our game needs to be lifted. There are also many very positive reports which far outweigh the minor failings.

Reviewed in an overall context, the Annual Report reveals that public safety has been paramount, membership is up, fund raising has been successful, social activities have been more than regular, and the season has concluded in a manner that will ensure the Club enters the next season well organised and financially sound.

LIFE SAVING AND PATROLS

This season was a delight for the Club Captain in selecting patrols with so many members available to roster. Twelve patrols were formed under patrol captains John Bedwell, Don Burke, Peter Burke, Mark Fitzgerald, Jeff Lucke, Matt Larkin, Steve McDonald, Dave O'Grady, Paul Potter, Mark Thompson, Mark Wallace, and Mark Warncken.

At the start of the season, each patrol had an average of seven members but as new members joined and gained their awards, the average patrol strength at the start of 1991 increased to nine members in each patrol.

Special efforts were made this year to ensure that all patrol members undertook and passed the proficiency test early in the season. This was exceptionally successful with 63 of the 88 members proficient at the first test on 21 October 1991.

In accordance with Association requirements, Stanwell Park beach was patrolled on each Sunday and public holidays from Sunday 23 September 1990 up until Anzac Day, Thursday 25 April 1991. Patrols were also in attendance to support the Council lifeguards each Saturday from 3 November 1990 until 23 March 1991.

The summer season was one for surfing, and good crowds were recorded on most weekends from December through to March. Sea conditions were generally good, resulting in the overall number of rescues being down to one of our lowest ever - 13. Four of these rescues were effected with the aid of a rescue tube, one with a rescue board, and seven without any equipment. Surprisingly the I.R.B. despite its continual beach patrols, was only involved in one rescue.

Again the main objective of the patrols was not letting swimmers get into difficulties in the first place. The patrol log book records 590 persons were warned and encouraged to swim within the flags.

There were 34 cases of first aid recorded.

Club members assisted in three other incidents.

- * On 28 October 1990, a three year old child was dragged unconscious from the northern lagoon. Family friends who were aware of resuscitation procedures immediately commenced E.A.R. on the child under the supervision of a doctor who came to the scene. Subsequently Club members were notified and assisted with oxy-therapy until the arrival of Ambulance paramedics.

- * On 23 October 1990 an elderly lady passed out at the northern end of the beach, apparently suffering from heart difficulties. Club members assisted with oxy-therapy until the arrival of Ambulance officers.
- * On 25 April 1991, a hang glider pilot crashed into the sea at the northern point. He was rescued by Club members in the I.R.B. and subsequently sent to hospital for observation.

PATROL DEFAULTS

During the season, all members of one patrol were asked to meet with the Executive regarding their patrol attendance, whilst one other member was also asked to attend to discuss his attendance. Four members were asked to meet with a committee of three Life Members concerning irregular use of Club equipment, and a further member was asked to meet with the Executive regarding use of Club rescue equipment. All matters were satisfactorily resolved.

COMMENDATIONS

From the Illawarra Branch Deputy Superintendent regarding gear inspection -

"...your gear was of the highest standard and a credit to the Club to have a deduction of nil points out of a possible 400 was a great achievement and a just reward for the obvious efforts that were put in for the preparation of your equipment for the coming season."

From the President of Coalcliff S.L.S.C. regarding the entry of their junior activity members in inter-club carnivals -

"...convey our appreciation of the assistance and efforts provided by one of your members, Steve McDonald....

We know Steve has gone out of his way to enable Coalcliff to qualify our nippers and guide us on all necessary follow up to ensure competitioncould take place.

PATROL COMPETITION

For many years, the Club has conducted its own patrol competition. In recent years, the opportunity has been taken to expand the competition to bring it in line with the B.H.P. Inter-club Patrol Efficiency Competition conducted by the Illawarra Branch. This has been effective in improving the skills and knowledge of our patrol members as well as preparing them for random checks by the Illawarra Branch panels for the inter-club competition.

The competition this season was conducted on attendance for patrols, proficiency among members, equipment on beach, completion of log books, and an assessment of life saving techniques including a mock rescue.

The winning patrol recorded 96.26 points, followed closely by other patrols with 95.51 points and 95.26 points.

INTER-CLUB PATROL COMPETITION

In the Illawarra Branch Inter-club competition, which involved random inspections based on similar criteria, Helensburgh-Stanwell Park was officially placed 3rd with a loss of 316 points after three inspections.

A further inspection carried out early in the season by two Illawarra Branch officers was ruled invalid - however the Management Committee and other members of the Club believe the inspection to have been conducted fairly and unbiased and should have been allowed. Had this inspection with no points lost, been allowed, our Club would undoubtedly have won this inter-club competition.

COMPETITIVE EQUIPMENT

"The Roger Williamson, OAM" surf boat is our major item of competitive equipment. This is equipped with rolling seats and two sets of oars.

Other competitive equipment includes two double skis, one single ski, and one malibu board. Because of the small number of members who have been involved in competition this season, there has been little demand for additional equipment.

New equipment obtained this season included a further set of oars for the surf boat and rolling seats, and a new malibu board.

RESCUE EQUIPMENT

Rescue equipment has been maintained throughout the season in a first class condition, having been highly commended when inspected by Illawarra Branch officers at the start of the season.

Major items of equipment owned by the Club at 30 June 1991 were -

- * Two fully equipped I.R.B.s, with three motors.
- * Five rescue boards
- * Three surf reels
- * Five rescue tubes
- * Two oxy vivas
- * Two U.H.F. radios

New equipment acquired during the year included a U.H.F. radio for use in the I.R.B., two rescue boards, a new I.R.B. motor and an I.R.B. mat.

One I.R.B. motor was sold towards the end of the season.

The value of Club rescue equipment is assessed at approximately \$30,000.00.

TEAM MANAGERS REPORT

This season saw the Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Club have a mixed success at carnivals. At the start of the season, we had a very good attendance of competitors and we were winning or in the finals of most events that were contested, with Don Burke and Andrew Bedwell standing out.

The junior boat crew were becoming more and more competitive each week after a good season the previous year, and our board riders and paddlers were also putting in some good performances.

As the season progressed things became a little disorganised, due to the fact that a couple of competitors decided that "they" would compete at a carnival and forgot about their patrol duty. Just another reminder - patrols come first, then competition. Anyway the problem was resolved and rectified.

Then we had a spate of injuries to most of our senior competitors, broken bones, hamstringing hassles, broken hearts, etc, just to mention a couple, but in the meantime some of the juniors and cadets began to come good and we continued on the winning way.

At the B.H.P. Illawarra Branch Championships, we were well represented and competed to our best ability. Some good results were obtained and while we did not win a swag of medals, those who did compete gave their all. Gold Medals were won in three events, one silver medal, and bronze medals in five events.

At the I.M.B. Stillwater Championships, John Boyle and Kevin Morton were placed third in the open double ski event.

At the B.H.P. Illawarra Branch I.R.B. Championships, the Park team gained a silver medal and two bronze medals.

The N.S.W. At the time of writing this report, the State I.R.B. Championships had not been held, the I.R.B. report should show the results.

In concluding I was disappointed with the march past team effort this season. It is an honour to wear the Park cap and represent your Club in the march past. As you know our club was one of the first formed 83 years ago and a lot of members have passed through the ranks. The effort that we to-day show does not reflect the efforts of past members in establishing this great club. So next time if asked to march, please don't pass it on to someone else, stand up and march proud.

SOCIAL ACTIVITIES

The Club's social calendar now extends over the full season and regular events were conducted to keep members socially involved. Following are brief details of all activities, both social and fund raising.

Old Boys Re-union - held on Sunday 19 August 1990 at Helensburgh Workmens Club. Approximately 65 members attended.

Triple 000 Night - held on Saturday evening 25 August 1990 at the Helensburgh Workmens Club, this was the second fund raising activity organised by the Workmens Club. Members of the three emergency services attended and were very generous in their financial support of the Surf Club.

Sea Eels Presentation Day - this was held in the Surf Club on Sunday 9 September 1990 following the Sea Eels Championships at Coal Cliff pool.

H.W.C. Ball - this function on Saturday evening 27 October 1990 was arranged at the instigation of the Surf Club, and of the 220 attendees, slightly more than 200 were either Surf Club members or their friends. Although most of the younger members did not know much about guest artist Little Pattie and could not keep up with the band, the night was regarded as an excellent social evening.

Surf Club Open Day - this was held on Sunday 4 November 1990 and was intended as a combination of a sponsors afternoon and a general invitation to local residents to visit the Surf Club. All sponsors were invited to attend and the opportunity was taken to thank them for their support during the past season.

The new I.R.B. donated by Helensburgh Workmens Club was officially christened by Mrs Dot Krinks, and the "Roger Williamson OAM" was again christened, this time as a Helensburgh-Stanwell Park boat by Mrs. Williamson, wife of Roger Williamson.

Zone Surf Carnival - this season, it was decided to run a split carnival at four different venues in the Illawarra Branch in an endeavour to attract more competitors. Junior Group Disco - following the formation of a Junior Group within the Club, one of their first social activities was an alcohol free disco, held on Saturday 14 April 1991. More than 80 of our younger members and their friends attended.

Seagulls Presentation - held on Sunday afternoon 15 April 1991 in the Surf Club.

End of Season Patrol Dinner - held in the Surf Club on Saturday evening 28 April 1991 followed by a well attended disco. Thanks to Liz Powell and her catering crew, 105 of our patrol members were treated to a special dinner in acknowledgement of their patrol service during 1990/91.

Trivial Pursuit Night - held at the Surf Club on Saturday evening, 11 May, 1991. This was attended by about 90 members and friends who in tables of ten answered specially prepared questions.

Sea Eels Bush Dance - held in the Surf Club on Saturday evening 18 May 1991 with music provided by Lizard Dust.

Presentation Night - held in the Surf Club on Saturday evening 1 June 1991.

Winter Board Riding Championships - held at Stanwell Park beach on Saturday 8 June and programmed for the following day. However bad weather forced the postponement until Monday 10 June, but again bad weather forced the competition to be transferred to Sandon Point. Presentations were held that afternoon in the Surf Club.

Woolshed Night - last function of the year on Saturday evening, 29 June 1991 at Albion Park Woolshed. It was initially expected to be a function for both older and younger members, instead of a formal dinner with only limited seating available. However, only 40 members and friends attended.

JUNIOR GROUP

A think-tank seminar is to be held early in July to allow the younger members to voice their opinions and suggestions. Members of the Management Committee have been invited to attend and take note of the ideas put forward, giving the Committee a better indication of the most desired direction to follow to keep this most important group of life savers active within the Club.

CLUB ADMINISTRATION

Management and Executive Committees

The Management Committee met on nine occasions during the year. The May 1991 meeting was cancelled when only two members attended, whilst meetings were not scheduled for July 1990 and June 1991.

At the start of the season, it was decided that meetings would be held in the Surf Club at 8.30am every fourth Sunday morning. Attendance proved to be very poor and over the whole season averaged only ten members per meeting.

The Executive Committee met formally on seven occasions throughout the year, and on an ad hoc basis as and when required.

Because of the small attendance at the Sunday morning meetings this season, the Executive Committee has already proposed that Committee meetings next year be held on a Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday evening.

Election of Office Bearers, 1990/91 season

For the first time, a different approach was taken to the calling of nominations for office bearers. All members were circulated by letter in June 1990, and asked to submit nominations in writing one week prior to the Annual General Meeting. Nominations received at that date were then published and circulated to all members prior to the meeting. Only if there was no nomination for a position by the closing date, were nominations invited from the floor at the Annual General Meeting.

This principle allowed all members to consider their position well in advance of the meeting and make a decision on whether to nominate as an office bearer. The Management Committee has since agreed to adopt a similar arrangement for the coming season.

As a gesture of honouring our long standing members, the Executive Committee proposed that a Life Member be elected as Patron, and that such member be elected for one season only. Jim Thorn was elected for the current season.

The position of Treasurer was not filled at the Annual General Meeting, and was referred to the Management Committee. Subsequently, Harley Dreghorn accepted the position at the August meeting.

Mark Alvos, Chief First Aid Officer, transferred from the Club during October, 1990, and resigned from the position. The vacant position has been filled by Jason Powell since 14 October 1991.

Sub-Committees

Following the Club seminar in July 1990, the opportunity was taken to segregate fund raising from the responsibility of the Social Committee, by forming a separate Fund Raising Committee.

Also as a result of discussions at the seminar, a Life Saving Committee consisting of the Club Captain, other officers and representatives of the patrol captains was formed. The Committee met informally during the early part of the season as arranged by the Club Captain.

The Social Committee met informally throughout the year to plan social functions. The House Committee did not meet, whilst the Fund Raising Committee met early in the season to plan the Annual Lifesavers Appeal Day collection.

The Finance Committee did not meet during the year, whilst the Sponsorship Committee met on one occasion to determine a shopping list of equipment to be sought by sponsorship during the season.

An additional Sub-Committee was formed at the October 1990 meeting to raise funds for the junior boat crew. Known as the Junior Boat Crew Supporters Group, this sub-committee was purely established to run raffles to provide equipment for the boat crew.

As reported elsewhere a Junior Group was formed at the March Committee meeting, specifically to plan and promote Club activities for the under 21 year old members of the Club.

A sub-committee consisting of three members was formed in March 1991 to review and recommend what should be done with the "Con Asmussen" surf boat, now that it is no longer being used. Several suggestions have been made including display of the whole boat within the Surf Club, or display of a portion of the boat. The Sub-committee is still to make recommendations to the Management Committee.

Incorporation

As indicated in the previous Annual Report, it is intended the Club become incorporated. Special meetings of members have endorsed this action, however, Club Rules need to be completely rewritten to conform to requirements of the Corporate Affairs Commission.

Work on rewriting the Rules has been progressing for some months, but has been deferred because of more urgent priorities.

Illawarra Branch S.L.S.A.

The Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Club was again affiliated with the Illawarra Branch of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia. The Club was represented at all but one meeting of the Illawarra Branch by its two delegates; only one delegate represented at the other meeting.

Club members continue to be actively involved in Branch activities, viz -

- * Don Harris, a Vice President of the Branch.
- * Evan Griffiths, Don Harris, Jeff Lucke, and Bob White are active members of the Board of Life Saving Control, whilst Klaus Herrmann joined this year as a competition member.
- * Bob White was District Supervisor for Helensburgh-Stanwell Park and Coal Cliff Clubs and from 27 February 1991, Jeff Lucke took over as District Supervisor for Coal Cliff.
- * Jeff Lucke and Bob White were members of the Gear Inspection Committee, whilst Jeff was also a member of the B.H.P. Patrol Efficiency Committee.
- * Jeff Lucke and Bob White held positions of beach and craft referee respectively.
- * Other Club members held positions on the Branch J.A.C. Panel of Judges.

Jeff Lucke was also a member of the State Education Panel.

Illawarra Branch Life Saver of the Year

Club Captain Don Burke and President Don Harris were both nominated for the position of Illawarra Branch Life Saver of the Year.

Don Burke was successful in reaching the final six candidates for this award.

Club Newsletter

Ten issues of The Park Bench have been published during the year and have been sent to all active patrol members and other interested members to keep them informed of Club activities. At the end of the season, 160 copies were being distributed.

Publicity/Public Relations

The most positive item of publicity this season was undoubtedly the rescue of a hang glider pilot from the sea to the north of the beach on Anzac Day. Three club members featured in the photograph and story.

Other publicity included short articles prepared and placed in local newspapers by the Publicity Officer.

Special messages of thanks to local residents were included in the Helensburgh and District News regarding Life Savers Appeal Day.

An Open Day, with extensive publicity, was arranged on Sunday 4 November 1991. Unfortunately the day failed to attract many local residents to visit the Club.

As a result of discussions at the Club seminar, the Committee considered undertaking a survey of local residents to see how they perceive the Club, and whether they believe their donations to the Club are being spent wisely. The survey form needs to be refined and the method of undertaking the survey is still to be resolved.

Hon. Beach Inspectors

Applications were submitted to and approved by Wollongong City Council to appoint 15 Club members as honorary beach inspectors.

However because Council officers were not able to provide a clear definition of the legal standing of honorary beach inspectors and confirm that Council would support such members in the event of a legal challenge, the Management Committee advised such members that they were not compelled to take any action to enforce the conditions of Ordinance 52 of the Local Government Act pending clarification from the Illawarra Branch and/or Council.

Club House

Despite many discussions at Management Committee meetings, the Club has not yet come to grips with maintenance of the Club house. It has been suggested that the House Committee should be responsible whilst some members believe the caretakers are responsible. The issue was debated at the July 1990 seminar and subsequently a Club House Maintenance Officer was elected.

Working bees have been programmed but all but one has failed due to lack of support.







If the matter is not attended to in the near future, many of the small problems which now exist will expand to become major concerns. Obviously this is something which the new Committee will need to address at its first opportunity.

Several suggestions previously put forward by the House Committee such as having the Clubs name on the Club house, and an improved entrance adjacent to the first aid room have not yet been implemented.

During the season, a new and larger office was constructed in the upstairs section of the Club house, releasing the former office for a lockable storage area for carnival equipment.

The kitchen area was upgraded during the year with additional cupboards and bench top, and more modern cooking facilities.

Negotiations are still proceeding with Wollongong City Council regarding the completion of a lease agreement for the Club house. The intention is that the Surf Club will be responsible for all internal work, and painting of the exterior walls, with Council accepting responsibility for maintenance of the structural items.

During the season, request was made to Council to carry out renewal of the guttering and roller doors to the boat shed, plus attend to rust on exterior doorways, around eaves, etc. The roller doors have been replaced and guttering renewed, but other work remains to be done.

Council was also requested to attend to seepage problems with water entering the I.R.B. area and boatshed following rain. A water sealant applied to the rear wall has improved but not eliminated the problem.

Late in the 1989/90 season, Council approached the Club regarding an outstanding debt of \$1,000.00 dating back to 1983 when the Club house was under construction. This concerned a commitment given to the Council to assist with the construction by payment of \$5,000.00, however only \$4,000.00 was paid, the balance being used towards fit out of the interior of the building.

Council has since agreed to waive the debt.

CLUB SEMINAR

On Saturday 7 July 1990 a Club Seminar attended by 27 members was held. The general theme was to discuss and consider options for a number of minor but important issues that have in the past tended to take up too much of the Management Committee's time. At the end of the season, some of the items had been implemented whilst others still require further development, for example, an expenditure budget that is based on Club objectives and priorities rather than allocating funds to a specific area the same as in previous seasons.

Items introduced during the year include -

- * Increases to Club fees and other charges to be related to increases in cost of living adjustments, but subjected to periodical review say every five years.
- * New arrangements to effect a smoother transition for J.A.C. members into the Club as patrolling members, to avoid potential loss of members.
- * Run special functions for under 18 years members, including functions away from the Surf Club.
- * Remove fund raising responsibilities from the Social Committee to enable the committee to concentrate purely on social activities.
- * Social committee to be structured with more younger people.
- * Determine and publish dates for committee meetings for the whole season and advise all members of such dates.
- * Establish a board room or committee room for meetings in the Surf Club.
- * Run refresher courses for all active members prior to proficiency tests, and as an incentive to completing the test early in the season, hold a social BBQ following the proficiency tests.
- * Competitors to enter their name and events in a special book for carnival entries, rather than leaving it to the Team Manager to enter them.

Items still to be considered and developed

- * Expenditure budget to be prepared based on Club objectives and priorities.
- * Greater involvement from individual Club officers and section leaders in seeking sponsorship, with all members being kept up to date with the Clubs financial position.
- * Consider a family membership fees structure, possibly to include J.A.C. Seagull membership.
- * Utilise the Club newsletter to advise members of what is involved in gaining awards and the benefits to the Club.

CLUB PHOTOGRAPHS AND MEMORABILIA

Bryant and Phyllis Phillips have continued to collect and protect many Club photographs and most are now safe in albums.

Some of our more historical photographs and photographs of State and Australian champions need to be on permanent display. It has been proposed that the upstairs section of the Club house would be a suitable location and all that is now required to complete this project is the acquisition of suitable good quality frames, and curtains on the windows to protect the photographs from the sun light.

FINANCE REPORT
