

- * Continuing financial support from the local community.

Of course, anyone who believes that Annual Reports only portray good news lives in "fairy land" and for every highlight, we must be prepared to accept there is also a downfall. As you read their reports, you will find several Club officers have highlighted problems, and these will need to be addressed by the incoming Committee.

Undoubtedly, the most serious matter was a patrol default which as well as being a safety issue, cost the Club the honour of winning the B.H.P. Patrol Efficiency Competition, something which has been strived for for some years.

This Annual Report concludes the last season in a decade - the ten year period from the end of our 75th year to our 85th year. The Club has seen many changes in that time, but three of the more significant ones that come quickly to mind -

- * Less rescues, hopefully suggesting we are patrolling better, and using modern technology to achieve better results.
- * More patrol members but of a younger average age.
- * The Club house completed and officially opened, after a seven year construction programme.

In closing, I would like to take this opportunity in thanking my fellow Executive members for their time and effort in making it a great season.


Finally to Harley Dreghorn, speaking on behalf of the Club, congratulations and thank you for your dedication and service in your 14 years as Club Secretary.



GEAR INSPECTION

Club equipment was presented for inspection by Illawarra Branch officers prior to the commencement of the season.

Branch officers again complimented the Club on having well maintained and presented equipment.

Special thanks to the members who worked to bring the equipment to good condition.

PATROL DEFAULT

On Saturday 9 January 1993, only two proficient members were on patrol, instead of the minimum of three. As a result the Club Executive was required to meet with the Illawarra Branch Board of Life Saving Control Executive to show cause why the Club should not be suspended from competition. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Club was "fined" 100 points in the BHP Patrol Efficiency Competition.

This was a very disheartening result, which cost the Club dearly in prestige as the "top" Club in the Branch, as well as considerable dollars in prize money.

The members concerned were suitably spoken to by the Club Captain regarding their failure to attend for patrols.

CLUB PATROL COMPETITION

The Club Patrol Competition this season was based on attendance for patrols, the number of members of a patrol proficient, and completion of log books.

BRANCH PATROL COMPETITION

Despite a general improvement in performance over the last few years, to achieve 2nd placing in 1991/92, the Club was placed 4th this season will a loss of points. A patrol default (see above) when only two members were signed on for patrol resulted in a deduction of 100 points, which effectively cost the Club 1st placing.

IRB CAPTAINS REPORT

The past season has had its ups and downs. On the patrol side, it was a quiet time with no major rescues or disasters. I was pleased to see an increased involvement by members taking care of the IRB and motors.

I must make mention that I am disappointed that not one member attempted to gain the IRB Drivers Certificate this season considering the number of active members within the Club. This Club needs as many drivers as possible, once members have gained their MSB licence, it only takes about six to eight weeks training.

On the other side, the Club has had a very good competitive season with seven medals gained at the Branch titles and a very good 7th placing at the State titles in the Tube Rescue event.

The State titles was a story in itself -15 minutes before the first event we were down to one motor. So to get to the final was a fitting reward to all of the team members.

I would like to thank everyone for their assistance during the season, and would like to make a note of special thanks to the Centennial Hotel Helensburgh for their assistance in the purchase of competition jackets for the team members.

CHIEF INSTRUCTOR'S REPORT

This concludes another successful season with 38 awards being obtained by new and old Club members, a very good effort.

The season started favourably with a meeting of members interested in obtaining life saving awards. This meeting resulted in a number of squads being formed for both Surf Life Saving Certificates and Bronze Medallions. All that was lacking was the necessary number of willing instructors.

Thanks to the consistent efforts of Jeff Lucke, Don Harris, Peter McDonald, Mark Thompson, Steven Connor, Bill Haran, Peter Turner, Hector Thompson and James Powell, the candidates were more than competently instructed in all facets of surf life saving.

Dave Winner in his role of District Supervisor played a significant part in helping members gain their awards. Dave witnessed swim tests, conducted Part A of the exam, provided direction where needed and encouragement to struggling members and ran very efficient exams.

64 Club This season members successfully completed the annual proficiency test in what could be described as less than ideal conditions. Other members subsequently became proficient during the season. Despite constant emphasis on the importance of being proficient many members are failing to take the test which is now the standard for all life savers wishing to Next season should see a patrol. change in this attitude with more pretest training.

Proficiency was also due for ARC holders with 12 being retrained and tested in Air-bag techniques and patient care and assessment. With thanks to Bobo and Jeff for their assistance, four ARC awards have been gained. This is an important award which is a must for all patrolling life savers to obtain.

Thanks to everyone who contributed to training and instruction during the season.



TEAM MANAGERS REPORT

This season saw a vast improvement in the number of members taking part in inter-Club competition.

Money raised was used towards Club jackets for the Australian Championships for competitors and officials who had participated at carnivals on a regular basis.

Congratulations to Simon Harris who was rewarded for his hard training by being selected in the Under 18 Illawarra Branch Team.

Graham Murdoch made Club history by being the first Helensburgh-Stanwell Park competitor to win the Illawarra Open Beach Sprint.

In the board riding area, Karl Herrmann proved to be a fierce competitor, going on to win the Under 18 Branch Board Riding Event.

At State level a team of approximately 20 members flew the flag for the Club with some notable achievements.





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COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Again meetings have been poorly attended, despite efforts to convene them on days to suit the majority of Committee members. Several meetings were cancelled because of lack of a quorum, with business being dealt with by the Club Executive.

As mentioned in the previous Annual Report, an 85th Anniversary Committee was formed under the chairmanship of Bobo White to plan and run special functions during the 85th year. The Committee took over planning for the Cabaret/dinner, the end result being an attendance of 260 members and friends at this gala event.

ELECTION OF OFFICE BEARERS

Advance nominations were again called for positions on the Club Management Committee. During the year, there were no resignations or changes to office bearers.

INCORPORATION

Although formal application was made for incorporation of the Club immediately prior to the end of the 1991/92 season, the application was not progressed when it became obvious that Committee meetings were unlikely to be held regularly in accordance with the Club Rules. This is now an urgent issue that must be addressed by the incoming Committee.

CLUB RULES

No changes were made or sought to the Rules, Regulations and By-laws during the season.

At this time, the Club Rules are available for perusal by members on request. In accordance with an earlier Minute recorded at a Committee meeting, it is necessary that the Rules be exhibited within the Club house where members can peruse them.

TRAINEE OFFICERS

This project was not progressed during the season; it ideally requires the services of a member of the Club Executive to set up and run.

THE PARK BENCH

The monthly Club newsletter has continued, although only seven issues were printed during the year. Circulation has been extended to include the families of the Junior Section.

PUBLICITY & COMMUNITY RELATIONS As an organisation which seeks and obtains a great deal of financial support from the local community, it is imperative that every possible effort be made to promote the Club.

For the first time this season, the opportunity was taken to distribute a Report to the Community, an abridged two page version of our Annual Report. From feedback received, many local residents were pleased to receive the report which gave them a better understanding of the Surf Club as a community organisation and not only a sporting body.

CLUBHOUSE

The Club building as reported in previous Reports, has now reached the stage where some tender-loving-care is necessary to bring the inside back up to a high standard.

Considerable work is required to the downstairs area, in the showers and amenities, whilst the main hall, kitchen and amenities require many odd jobs to be completed.

The 1st floor has been turned into a meeting room and photo gallery showing many years of history in one room. Thanks to Peter McDonald for his printing and photo framing skills, and Lorna Dreghorn for her curtain making skills, these valuable photographs are now well protected.

CLUB TRADING

Similar to previous years, a separate account has been operated for the Club's trading activities, principally for the sale of soft drinks and other refreshments to members. At the end of the year, a cash surplus of \$9,000.00 was transferred to the Club's general account.

FINANCE & FUND RAISING

The Finance Committee was again active in controlling the Club's finances. Our main source of income continued to be donations and sponsorship, supplemented by the Club's trading activities. Fortnightly raffles were introduced during the summer period, and were well supported by Club members.

At the start of the year, the Finance Committee considered a number of requests for funds from various Club officers. With some discretion, most of requests were endorsed the and subsequently approved bv the Management Committee. Additional competitive equipment has been acquired, the Club's name placed on the building, and the front entrance to the Club house improved.

Over the year however, there was a fall in end-of-year bank balances from around the \$20,700.00 mark to \$15,000.00.

DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

The Club Executive was asked to appear before the Branch Board of Life Saving Control to answer a complaint that there were insufficient patrol members on duty on 9 January 1993. For this the Club was "fined" 100 points in the Illawarra Branch B.H.P. Patrol Efficiency Competition.

The Club Captain formally warned the members of the offending patrol of their obligations whilst one member who had missed that patrol and an earlier patrol to attend carnivals, was required to undertake a number of penalty patrols.

The Club Captain also directed other members to undertake additional patrols when they neglected to attend rostered patrols whilst attending carnivals.

Following the Australian Championships, the Executive Committee investigated a series of complaints about the behaviour of a number of members whilst part of the Club touring team. One member was formally warned, and other members spoken to regarding behaviour expected of them on future occasions. ILLAWARRA BRANCH INVOLVEMENT The Club was affiliated with Surf Life Saving - Australia, through Illawarra Branch.

Jeff Lucke was elected Deputy Branch Superintendent, and a member of the Life Saver of the Year, Meritorious Awards, and Life Membership Committees.

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Don Harris was elected as Patrol Director, and was also a member of the Finance and Judiciary Committees.

Evan Griffiths was again elected as State B.J.A. Superintendent.

Harley Dreghorn and Peter McDonald took on positions as Branch coordinators of the N.S.W. State Development Plan. Their role is to gather information from members on how they see Surf Life Saving - New South Wales developing over the next five to ten years.

APPRECIATION

This has been my final year as Club Secretary, something which I have enjoyed doing because of the support and friendship shown by others.

I would like to thank everyone involved, but space does not permit. I particularly appreciated the help of the Executive Committee this season, and in case no one else mentions it, I believe Mark and Katrina Thompson deserve a special commendation for the combined effort they have put into the Club over the past two years.

Peter McDonald also deserves a special thank you for his personal assistance to me in many ways. As well as being Assistant Secretary, Branch Delegate and Junior Group Manager, Peter was the unofficial reporter for The Park Bench. I am sure there were arguments between Peter and his wife Sandra as to who held the unthankful job of being Chief Janitor of the Club house, and who was the assistant. Well done Pete, and thanks Sandra.

Phil came up with the idea for the Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Surf Club to have a winter swim club four years ago, and we have not looked back since. Phil was our delegate to the SCWSA for four years and Vice President of the Association. Phil's successes at the South Coast championships will probably never be equalled, his friendship and association with the winter swim club will always be remembered. The Club has approached the SCWSA to have a perpetual trophy established in Phil's name.
