This was not widely accepted at first but many of the members found that the IRB is more fun than it looks once they got in it and had a go.

IRB training during the season produced five competent new drivers. Under the guidance of Mark Ryan and Steve Connor a with their team of Instructors who successfully trained these new drivers.

A new initiative by Jeff Lucke saw 15 of the Club's mothers gain their Resuscitation Certificates. These ladies felt that they needed to know what to do if something happened and resuscitation was necessary. Congratulations ladies, hopefully next season will see more of the Club's mothers gain an award.

The candidates will then be able to concentrate on the practical side of the Bronze Medallion.
