As President I am pleased to again be in a position to announce that no lives were lost in patrolled areas of the beach during 1994/95 season. This is an achievement our Club Captain Mark Thompson and all members can be proud of.

The Club was well represented on the beach and in the water at the limited number of Illawarra Senior carnivals, with the number of members entering water events being the highest for many years. The results obtained at all the carnivals were very good.

Our Boat Captain, Mark Wallace has done an excellent job with our young members, it is unfortunate for Mark and the boys that the boat is past it's use by date and is constantly out of the water for major repairs.

All the competitors achievements were noteworthy, particularly Trish McCarthy and Simon Harris. Trish competing for the first time at a Senior Australian Titles come fourth in the Under 16 Female Beach Flags, while Simon, who was competing for the first time in Open Beach Flags competition, won GOLD at Branch, SILVER at the State, and was eliminated in the last run before the finals at the Australian Titles.

It was very pleasing to see such a large contingent of enthusiastic competitors representing the Club at the Australian Championships at Kurrawa, competing at their best.

"The Park" can also be proud of their members who competed and officiated at the inaugural Illawarra Branch Masters Championships; the State Masters & Australian Masters Championships.

On the competition side we only had a go at the Branch Titles and with no training came away with three medals. This year competition is looking a lot better.

CHIEF INSTRUCTOR'S REPORT

Not a bad year in terms of awards gained by the Club, with a total 38 for the season.

This season started with a number of enthusiastic new and existing members interested in gaining their Bronze Medallion or Surf Life Saving Certificate. Some of these went through to complete their awards and others dropped out due to work or other interests. The Club welcomed 6 new award members who were successful in gaining an award.

Once again the instructors who took the time to train the squads did an exceptional job. It was a difficult task this season with a number of months worth of unfriendly surf conditions making it hard to get out on boards, in the tube and the IRB. Thank you to the Club Instructors Steve Connor, Bill Haran, Peter McDonald, Des O'Brien, Peter Turner, Mathew and Bobo White.

The District Supervisor was Evan Griffiths who assisted in examining Part A and B of the Bronze Medallion Exam and Surf Life Certificate Saving Exam. Evan provided valuable background on the surf life saving and his enthusiasm was а great encouragement to the candidates. Dave Wildin took on the role as Northern Zone Exam Coordinator. His unenviable job was to supervise the candidates sitting for the theory component of the Bronze Medallion. Thanks to Evan Don and Dave.

The Bronze Medallion Exam took on a new format this season, being broken into 3 components:

Theory - (written theory paper 40 questions)

- Part A (resuscitation, air bag, signals, radio and surfing awareness) and
- Part B (run-swim-run, board, tube & IRB rescues, one-person assessment).

The theory exam presented the most problems to the candidates. with some candidates sitting for the exam up to 4 times. The exam conditions required that no more than 4 questions be answered incorrectly and that all 5 resuscitation questions he answered correctly. The examiner could not tell the candidates which auestions they answered incorrectly; only the area of the Training Manual they had trouble with. The new format for the theory paper did not seem fair to the candidates and caused a number to contemplate dropping out as they felt they would never pass.

Proficiency Tests were well attended with 127 proficient members. This is an increase of 20 on last year. This year's theory component was well answered by members. The Club's all IRB crewperson skills have improved with the inclusion of IRB rescues in the Proficiency Tests. Thank you to Steve Winter for his time and patience in waiting for appropriate surf conditions to conduct the Proficiency Tests. Twenty members renewed their Advance Resuscitation Certificate, with an proficiency annual ARC beina required from this season on. Sixteen IRB Drivers completed their Proficiency for the season, being important to the Club as the IRB is the most efficient & popular method of rescue.

An off season program of ARC and Radio Operators Certificate boosted the total number of awards gained by the club. Resulting in 4 ROC, 4ARC & 1 ARCI.

Congratulations to all members who gained an award this season, and well done to all involved in training.

TEAM MANAGERS REPORT

The 1994/95 season was an encouraging one for Stanwell Park's with some promising Junior competitors coming up into the Seniors and a few keen competitors joining the Club.

The PARK colours were present at almost all carnivals on the coast, thanks to a dedicated band of competitors led by Simon Harris, Carly Lawrence and the boat crews.

The season's first major carnival was the inaugural "Masters" at Bulli, with well "seasoned" competitors coming out of the woodwork. Peter Turner starred in the water and Mark Thompson, Peter Lawrence, Steve Connor and Peter Burke taking medals on the beach. The day was an enjoyable one for THE PARK & a success for the Branch.
