


H.W.C. donates another IRB and motor

Helensburgh Workmens Club Ltd

Our major donor and patron for many years, H.W.C. donated \$10,000 over the last two years for the purchase of a fully equipped IRB and motor.

Appeal Day/Collection Day.

Despite an economic gloom in the town with the temporary closure of Metropolitan Colliery, local residents, businesses and shopkeepers nevertheless contributed an amount of \$4,364 for our annual door-knock collection, only a few hundred dollars short of the 1991 record of \$4,852.

This brings to \$38,000 the amount donated to our Club by the local community over the last ten years. This community support is very much appreciated.

Competition, what a great year for The Park, with the U/18 boat crew achieving some good results, followed by the good results at the Branch with the three Potter boys taking out the Flag events and Trish McCarthy with three Golds and a Silver, Mark Thompson the O/30 Sprint and Kurt Herrmann Gold in the Board Riding.

Trish McCarthy and James Potter then went on to the State to win Bronze medals.

At the Australian James Potter took out Gold and Kurt Herrmann a Bronze.

We had an excellent year winning medals, but to all our competitors whether you won or did not quite make it, you have competed for The Park and done our Club proud.

Steve Connor, President With completion of the 1996/97 season, it is with great pleasure that I congratulate all members of the Seagulls on their sportsmanship and behaviour at Club pointscores, inter-Club carnivals and when attending Club functions.

Once again our Seagulls have had a great season both at carnivals and pointscores. 91 Seagulls were capitated and 30 Sea Babies registered. Sunday morning pointscores were well attended, with 36 children gaining 100% attendance awards. This is a great effort considering most of these children also attend inter-Club carnivals each week.

Replacement of the National Awards with the new Surf Education program took a lot of organising and learning the new system. Thank you to Peter McDonald and your very small band of instructors. Next season, hopefully with more people prepared to instruct, we will see more improvements with this new program. Unfortunately for our very enthusiastic Seagulls and one enthusiastic instructor, weekly board and surf training had to be cancelled because of a lack of instructors and water safety. This was not good enough and not fair on Rod Hampson or the children.

Our children need regular training for their confidence and to be competitive and more support is needed. Thanks Rod for your sustained efforts.

Congratulations and a very big thank you to Tracy Buckley for securing donations to replace and acquire new competitive equipment and to the many donors who supported us.

Best wishes to the U/14 Seagulls who have now moved onto the senior ranks, not only are they all keenly enjoying patrols but have also swelled the ranks of the Friday evening Junior Group. To Matt White, thank you for organising Saturday patrols and assisting in the smooth running of patrols.


The number of patrol members is gradually increasing as shown on the next page. Assuming the same number of patrol members next season, we will look at increasing the number of patrols from 11 to 13.

Congratulations to all other competitors who have worn The Park cap this season.



- * 60 members attend 100% of patrols





- Saturday patrols (4 hours) December, January and February with 3 Bronze holders.
- Minimum one proficient IRB Driver on each patrol.
- * 3 radio patrols at Fairy Meadow radio base

12 new members join and gain initial SLSA award

- 20 Bronze Medallions
- 19 Surf Life Saving Certificates
- 5 Advanced Resuscitation Certificates
- 2 IRB Drivers and 1 Radio Operators Certificate
- 98% of Junior members trained and gualify in Surf Ed Certificates

Another good season with 47 awards gained. Bronze candidates ranged in age from 15 to 42 years and included nine new members.

16 candidates for the Surf Life Saving Certificate graduated from the Junior Activities Group. Another three candidates were new to the Club.

The new Bronze exam paper presented some difficulties with candidates required to concentrate more on learning the theory side of the manual rather than getting out in the surf and doing the practical work.

ARC training has been refined down to a course lasting five weeks, including the examination. ARC training courses are ongoing during the winter months.

Only two IRB Drivers Certificates were gained, with both candidates having to rely on training external to the Club.

Proficiency Tests -

The season ended with 111 proficient Bronze Medallion holders and 26 proficient Surf Life Saving Certificate members.

18 members were re-assessed for the Advanced Resuscitation Certificate, and 22 members passed the IRB Proficiency.


Juniors

Management Committee Meetings

Average attendance of officers at meetings was nine, less than half of the 19 appointed officers. Meetings were held monthly from August to May.

The agenda and structure of meetings was reviewed during March with the intention of restricting meetings to two hours, and encouraging more officers and members to attend the monthly weeknight meetings.

Three meetings of the Executive Committee were held.

Action Lists arising from Meetings

To assist officers follow up on tasks arising from Committee meetings, action lists were prepared; however at the end of the year, there was still a large number of items requiring attention.

The Park Bench

Issues were again irregular because of the workload of the Secretary and Assistant Secretary in other areas of the Club. The Management Committee acknowledges the value of The Park Bench as a communication medium to members and has amended the Publicity Officer's duties to include this task.

Planning Seminars

A planning seminar to develop a forward plan and promote the whole Club (both senior and junior sections) as one to work towards gaining a major sponsor, was deferred through lack of attendance.

A second date was set but the seminar was cancelled through lack of attendance.

The J.A.C. held other functions and the Junior Group (under 18s) held regular Friday evening activities in the Club house.

On 16 November 1996 a Testimonial Dinner attended by 200 Club and SLSA members, friends and members of other sporting bodies, was held in honour of Evan Griffiths. The function was organised by Jannine Powell and was a fitting tribute to one of our Life Members.

During November, the Club participated in the Centenary functions of our major donor Helensburgh Workmens Club, attending the Centenary Ball and participating in the street parade with both senior and junior members marching, a decorated float (thanks to John Ryan) with the "Burgh Workers" IRB and the Jim Thorn surf boat.

Surf Club Re-union

Jack McMillan with the assistance of Keith Newell has strived hard over the past two years to invigorate the Old Boys Re-union, now more aptly referred to as the Surf Club Re-union.

Questionnaires were sent to older members seeking suggestions on the venue, whether the re-union should be an annual or two yearly event, and general comments. Of those who responded, about half nominated the Surf Club as the preferred venue.

A five person organising committee will be established and elected at the AGM.

Registration of Members

Membership fees were reviewed during the year and restructured to include family membership.

SLSA requires all members (from age 7 upwards) to complete annually a membership application form. To facilitate completion of these forms, a position of Registrar was created and was filled this year by Steve McDonald.

To facilitate completion of forms by members, Steve "computerised" the form and developed a data base which effectively prints the form with members details. It is expected this will be extended to include the Junior members next season.

Club Rules include a membership category of Long Service, viz for former patrol members who have completed at least eight years of patrols. However because of lack of records (Log books etc) to confirm that a member has met the SLSA requirement, this membership category has not been used.

The membership category will be introduced retrospectively from next season, and once Long Service Membership is granted to a member, it applies for all future seasons.

Outstanding Amounts due by Members

During the year the Committee became aware that a number of members had neglected to pay various amounts due to the Club, including Club fees and charges for tee shirts and accommodation which had been paid on their behalf. At the end of the year, the members concerned had been advised of their indebtedness to the Club.

During the year, the Committee again raised concerns at the cost to the Club of carnival entry fees when members after being entered to a carnival, failed to attend or compete.

Refreshment Prices

The Club's trading account again showed a profit, although this year profit on purchases was less than 55%, far below previous years where profit has been closer to 80%. A review of prices is proposed.

Changes to Rules, By-Laws & Regulations The Management Committee became aware that current Club Rules permit all members to vote on almost all matters; members include Juniors from age 7 upwards.

Prior to the 1991 Constitution changes, only members over the age of 14 years or those holding the Surf Life Saving Certificate were eligible to vote on all matters, with those under 14 restricted to voting on issues relative to the Junior Activities Committee only.

Recommendation has been submitted that the previous arrangements should be reintroduced and a Motion to amend the Club By-law will be dealt with at the AGM.

90th Anniversary

Next season marks the 90th Anniversary of the Club, and special functions including a Dinner are proposed.

Aiready the Club has been granted approval to host the 1998 Branch Championships.

Club Building

The House Committee reviewed suggestions from members to extend the Club building in various ways, including a "garage" at the western end (to replace the container) with a flat roof and BBQ area on top, a verandah on the southern side, and a deck in front of the current observation room.

The Committee decided that ad hoc proposals were not acceptable and a total consolidated plan should be developed and approved by the Club before any extensions or alterations were progressed. The Committee requested that all members be invited to submit suggestions for consideration as part of the overall plan. This will be progressed early next season.

The Committee acknowledged with thanks the regular cleaning work carried out by Sandra and Peter McDonald, but agreed a weekly cleaning roster would be a fairer method for all concerned.

The Committee reviewed charges for private hiring of the Club house, but recommended no changes at this time.

The Management Committee approved a recommendation that half of the profit from refreshment sales each year be allocated towards Clubhouse extensions.

Proposals were developed to upgrade the First Aid Room with new cupboards etc and a donor is being sought to donate materials.

A review of keys on issue to members was commenced and keys are being withdrawn from members who no longer require them.

Some maintenance works have been undertaken, such as replacement of the rusted metal rail around the upper level landing, with a concrete block wall.

The interior of the Club building as previously reported needs "tender loving care" and working bees need to be programmed to rectify. During the year, ski and board racks and other fittings in the boat shed became dangerous through rusted parts; temporary repairs were effected.

Safety matters (including OH&S issues with storage of fuel) were considered, and further review is required to ensure the Club is complying with rules and regulations.

Advice was received through Surf Life Saving, Illawarra that Council was no longer proposing that individual Clubs enter into a lease arrangement for surf club buildings, ending a controversy which may have seen clubs meeting on-going maintenance costs.

Discussions with Council officers resulted in upgrading of the drainage system. Further discussions are required regarding tar sealing of the car park, and general maintenance to the building and surrounds, and disposal/recycling of Club waste.

Council sought approval for its lifeguards to utilise the patrol/radio room on days of inclement weather. Approval was granted for the current season only on condition Council indemnify the Club against any claims for injury, loss or damage arising from Council employees occupying the patrol room.

Asset Register

The Club still does not have a detailed Asset Register, making it difficult to account for Club property. The J.A.C. has identified and categorised all property under its control, as listed in the report.

An IRB and two motors were sold during the year. Two surplus metal fuel tanks which were to be sold, appear to have been stolen.

A new IRB and one motor was placed into service during the year.

Various requests have been made to the Committee to acquire additional hand held radios, a shade area for patrols on the beach, a new IRB fuel tank and a trailer for the IRB as well as competitive equipment.

Representation at Branch, State and Australian level

The Club was well represented at Branch level with Don Harris holding the position of Superintendent, and Jeff Lucke B.J.A. Superintendent.

Peter Beehag, Evan Griffiths, Don Harris, Jeff Lucke, Peter Turner and Bob White were accredited as Examiners and Competition Members, Mark Ryan as a Specialist Examiner (IRB), and Klaus Herrmann and Ron McCormack as Competition Members

Evan Griffiths held the position of District Supervisor for Stanwell Park and Jeff Lucke District Supervisor for Coal Cliff. Jeff Lucke was a member of the Life Membership Honours Committee.

Evan Griffiths and Bob White were members of the BHP Patrol Inspection Panel and Peter Beehag, Evan Griffiths, Don Harris and Jeff Lucke were members of the Gear Inspection Panel.

Mark Thompson was B.J.A. Team Manager.






