

#### Helensburgh Workmens Club Ltd

The previous season saw a donation of \$10,000 from H.W.C. for the purchase of a fully equipped IRB. Application was not made for a major donation this year, but H.W.C. continues to be our major financial supporter and Patron of the Club.

H.W.C. again offered the Surf Club the opportunity to run the Anzac Day Two-up Game, resulting in \$1,000 being raised through donations from patrons.

H.W.C. honoured two of our members who excelled by winning the male and female Illawarra Branch Junior Lifesaver of the Year, with suitably embroidered tracksuits.

The Workmens Club also supported the Boaties fund raising venture and to the H.W.C. Board and members, we again send our sincere thanks for your on-going commitment towards our Club's community service and youth development activities.

#### Appeal Day/Collection Day.

Although organised at short notice, and on the same day as the Helensburgh Fair run by the Lions Club, the annual collection day was very successful with \$4002 raised.

Thank you to local residents, businesses and shopkeepers for again supporting the Surf Club in its community service role.

#### Surf Boat Fund Raising Venture.

This venture was planned and promoted by Club members from the boat rowing section, with an objective target of \$20,000 to purchase a new surf boat, oars and ancillary equipment. Whilst the target was not reached, the efforts of the boating members in securing donations from 122 supporters totalling \$15,600 was a creditable result.

The Winter Swimming group donated \$250 to the Club for the purchase of rescue equipment, and also supported the Boaties fund raising venture.

## **Surf Boat Fund Raising Venture**

This venture commenced in February 1997 with a target of raising \$20,000 through the sale of 200 vouchers at \$100 each. Selling concluded mid-September 1997 with a total of \$15,600 raised from 122 donors.

All funds were used in the acquisition of a surf boat and associated equipment.

All donors were given the opportunity of having their company name drawn from sale vouchers for advertising rights to the surf boat and oars. Dick Richards Trucks Pty Ltd of Padstow gained advertising rights to the boat, whilst Kissells Family Meats of Heathcote gained advertising rights to the oars.

Donations were attracted from the local area, and by members with contacts outside our traditional fund raising area. The highest donation came from a company which requested to remain anonymous, and there were several \$500 donations including one from a Club member. - No Lives Lost during Clubs' rostered patrol hours
- 77 persons rescued
- First aid treatment to 178 persons, mostly from blue bottle stings
- 123 proficient Bronze holders and 32 proficient Under 16 Cadets members

I would like to thank all our members for their efforts in patrolling Stanwell Park beach this season.

The number of patrols was increased this season from 11 to 13 due to the growing numbers of patrol members.

For most of the season patrols went well but near the end of the year especially over the Easter weekend, a few members forgot about their patrol commitments.

A special thanks to three members Matthew White, Matthew McDonald and Andrew Taylor for doing voluntary patrols over the Easter weekend to ensure the Club met its patrol obligations.

This season 61 members achieved 100% patrol attendance.

Congratulations to Steve McDonald for winning the Patrol Member of the Year. Steve has been a patrol captain for a number of years and does an excellent job year in and out.

The Club Patrol Competition was a hard fought contest as it is every year with patrol 11 led by Scott Boyle and Rick Dzopalic gaining first place.

A big thanks to our District Supervisor Evan Griffiths for running the Patrol Competition.

In the BHP Illawarra Branch Patrol Competition, we achieved 3rd place putting the Club back near the top again. After a mix-up in our commitment to man the Branch radio base in the 1996/97 season, and a mandatory loss of points in the Competition, we rated 13th. This year The Park wins the award for the "most improved club" and a rescue board from Sydney Water.

This season saw a large number of awards gained. Well done to Steve McDonald and his team of instructors for the time and effort they put in each week in training our new patrol members.


Thanks to Rick Dzopalic for an excellent job in his first season running the Club pointscore and championships.

#### Rescues and First Aid Activities





- Rescues 77 persons -

- Preventative Actions 730 persons warned or directed to safety
- First Aid treatment -
  - 170 stings (bluebottles, etc)
  - 4 cases minor first aid
  - 4 cases major first aid.

#### **Patrol Membership**

At the end of the season -

- 105 Bronze Medallion holders undertaking patrols, 83 male and 22 female.
- · 123 proficient Bronze Medallion holders.
- 32 Under 16 Cadet members undertaking patrols, 21 male and 11 female.
- 32 Cadet members proficient
- 13 Patrols each with an average of 7 Bronze Medallion holders and a minimum of one IRB Driver
- 61 members attend 100% of patrols





# Minimum Patrol strengths as set by Surf Life Saving Illawarra were achieved -

- September, October and November 3
   Bronze holders on Sundays and public holidays (8 hour patrols).
- December to Easter 4 Bronze holders on Sundays and public holidays (8 hour patrols).
- End-April 3 Bronze holders 4 hour patrols on Sunday mornings
- Saturday patrols (4 hours) December, January and February with 3 Bronze holders.
- Minimum one proficient IRB Driver on each patrol.
- · 3 patrols at Fairy Meadow radio base.

# **INSTRUCTION AND TRAINING**

- 6 new members join and gain initial SLSA award
- 13 Bronze Medallions and 12 Surf Life Saving Certificates gained
- 5 Advanced Resuscitation Certificates
- 97% of Junior members trained and qualify in Surf Education Certificates

This year saw a fall off in the number of awards gained by Club members, with a total of 33. The core awards of Bronze Medallion and Surf Life Saving Certificate, ensuring continued growth for the Club.

It was great to see five new members gain their Bronze and one new member gain the Surf Life Saving Certificate.

11 Junior members gained the Surf Life Saving Certificate and moved through to become Cadets.

The Club had a good success rate with Bronze and Surf Life Saving Certificate candidates with those putting in the work gaining their respective award. The new written paper was handled better this season by candidates with only a small number having to sit the test twice.

A younger age group trained for the Bronze Medallion with the oldest Club member at 31 years compared with 42 years last season.

Five Advanced Resuscitation Certificates and two Training Officer ARC, were gained during the off season. The ARC course was run over five weeks using the Clubs ARC Workbook, this being a successful combination with no failures.

No IRB Driver training was done during the season, which is very disappointing. The Club really needs to look seriously at encouraging the IRB fraternity to get some new IRB Drivers. Since the 1994/95 season the Club has only trained two drivers.

Two proficiency tests were held and at the end of the season 155 Bronze and Surf Life Saving Certificate holders were proficient.

24 IRB Drivers completed the IRB proficiency test in October, the early date ensured all drivers were proficient early in the season.

27 ARC holders renewed their ARC qualification. Refresher training for ARC commenced before the start of the season, this being an aim noted in last years report, with most completing the proficiency test late in November. This year's numbers was a big increase on last year.

The Club has a great team of instructors who put a great deal of work into training candidates for the Bronze and Surf Life Saving Certificate. Thanks go to Steve Connor, Peter McDonald, Darryl Turnbull, Peter Turner and Bobo White. In ARC training, thanks to Peter McDonald and Peter O'Halloran for assisting.

Thanks to Evan Griffiths and Ian Foreman for running two trouble free proficiency tests.

Once again thanks go to District Supervisor Evan Griffiths. Evan was always on hand to give advice or point our new candidates in the right direction. The Club instructors did a first class job this season with a great deal of success which makes the job much more enjoyable. Anyone interested in helping out or taking on a squad is most welcome to do so.

I look forward to next season as it approaches and hopefully we can put together a few more awards for the Club.

Finally congratulations to all new award holders, without you the Club would not be able to grow in the way it has continued to do over the past seasons.

#### **Committee Meetings**

Management Committee meetings were scheduled to be held monthly commencing from September. Meetings were not held in August, February or June.

This season a minimum of eight members of the Management Committee was required to form a quorum, this was only achieved at five of the eight meetings.

The Executive Committee met formally on four occasions and informally as required. Matters discussed at these meetings were reported at subsequent meetings of the Management Committee.

The Junior Activities Committee met monthly from September 1997 to April 1998, with Junior Activities. delegates reporting regularly to the Management Committee.

The Club House Committee met on one occasion to deal with Club house cleaning, and possible extensions to the Club building.

Meetings of the Finance and Sponsorship Committees were not held.

The position of Assistant Secretary was not filled.

Two positions of Delegates to Surf Life Saving Illawarra were also not filled. The Club was represented at all Branch meetings by at least one Club member.

#### Club Rules, By-Laws and Regulations

An amendment to Club By-Law 42 (b) was endorsed at the 1997 Annual General Meeting. The amendment restored an earlier rule which restricted Junior members to voting only on matters relative to Junior Activity issues.

#### Membership Forms and Fees

Revised fee schedules applied this season, with a standard fee of \$15 for all categories of membership, except Sea Babies \$5, and retired persons \$5.

Membership forms were again pre-printed based on information provided by members in the previous season. A computerised data base containing extensive details on all current members has been established and is able to provide statistical and historical information about the Club and its members. The data base was managed by current Registrar Steven McDonald.

Only two members applied for Long Service Membership, Greg Hand and Don Harris. This type of membership requires once-only approval from the Management Committee and a special application form is available.

Outstanding payments due from members At 30 June 1998, 10 Active Members had not paid their Club fees, despite reminders being sent by mail. The Management Committee adopted a conciliatory approach towards this problem rather than enforcing By-Law 56 (b) which allows termination of membership.

Various payments are also due to the Club in regard to -

- re-imbursement of carnival entry fees paid by the Club by members who fail to attend and compete.
- tee shirts purchased on behalf of competitors,
- accommodation booked but not used, with resultant lost deposits, and
- · training manuals supplied to members.

These payments are being pursued by the Management Committee.

#### **Notices to Members**

The Park Bench again served as an official newsletter and conveyed notices to members. The Park Bench was issued on seven occasions during the year.

#### Liquor Licence

The Club has continued to maintain a Function Licence to enable the sale of alcohol for consumption within the Club premises. The Licence is held by the Club Secretary, Harley Dreghorn.

Amendments to the Liquor Act and higher penalties have made it essential for the Club to introduce its own "House Rules" to protect the Licensee and Club members who volunteer their services to operate the bar.

The Management Committee endorsed a series of "House Rules" developed from State Licensing Laws and the existing Club Rules, By-Laws and Regulations to address enforcement of the Liquor Act regarding under-age drinking, and other offences.

# Compliance with Federal, State and Local Government Regulations.

Various obligations are placed on the Club and members to comply with OH&S regulations, noise pollution and other environmental requirements. The list increases yearly, and it is essential the Club keeps abreast of these issues and ensures its activities comply to avoid the possibility of penalties.

Ignorance is no longer accepted as an excuse for non-compliance, nor is an organisation's inability to meet the cost.

The Management Committee instigated a checking procedure; further action is required during the forthcoming season.

#### Incorporation requirements

The Annual Statement as required under the Associations Incorporation Act, 1984 was submitted to the Department of Fair Trading for the 1996/97 year and also the 1995/96 year.

#### Injuries to Club member

Sean O'Halloran suffered injury to his right ankle whilst on patrol in the IRB. Sean's medical and other expenses were met through Workcover (Worker's Compensation provided to Surf Life Saving members through the NSW Government).

#### **Training and Development**

Andrew Taylor was nominated to attend the 1998 Leadership Development Camp conducted by Surf Life Saving Australia at Lake Ainsworth, near Ballina. The cost was met by Surf Life Saving, NSW from the Carbine Club sponsorship.

#### **Assets Register**

The documentation and valuation of all Club equipment was progressed, but had not been finalised at the end of the year.

#### **Helping Others**

The Club made a donation of \$50 to the Hayley Gordon Appeal, a young local girl who requires specialist medical treatment.

The Junior Group (Under 18 members) organised a fund raising night to assist fellow member Alicia McCormack travel to New Zealand as part of a Combined High School State team.

Club members attending the Patrol Dinner organised a collection to assist former patrol member Greg McCarthy, in hospital as a result of a motor cycle accident.

#### 90th Anniversary Mementos

The Club purchased and sold 80 denim dress shirts embroidered with Club logo and 90th Anniversary Year, to members at \$25 each.

#### 90th Anniversary Year

A Sub-Committee chaired by Geoff Wood was formed to co-ordinate special activities for the 90th Anniversary Year.

The traditional five yearly Dinner Dance was held on Saturday 14 February 1998 at Sutherland Entertainment Centre, and attended by 300 members and friends.

With membership now at a younger age and to cater for our older members, a decision was taken to devote this function to a fun night with a minimum of speeches. Official guest was John Meehan, Life Member of Surf Life Saving, Illawarra and Surf Life Saving NSW, and a former Branch executive officer.

A second function, an official 90th Anniversary Luncheon combined with the annual Club Re-union was held two weeks later on Saturday 28 February 1998 at Helensburgh Workmens Club attended by 140 members. Guest speaker was Bill Seay, President of Port Kembla SLSC and an active patrol member with 50 years patrol service.

This function attracted members from as far afield as Canberra and Ballina and two of possibly our oldest members, Peter Cox (92) and Lon Duffy (93).

The third major function was the hosting of the 1998 Illawarra Branch Championships. The carnival was well organised with the Club being congratulated on its efforts from officials and competitors alike, was well attended, and Club members achieved a number of medals.

Major Club donors and supporters were invited to the Championships, and joined official Illawarra Branch sponsors for the Championships lunch.

The success of the Championships can only be attributed to many pre-carnival meetings, and a fantastic team effort on the day which involved members from all parts of the Club.

#### Club House

Following a meeting and inspection of the Club building with officers from Wollongong City Council, Council commenced extensive renovations to the building. This included -

- · replacement of stair rails
- replacing window rubber seals
- cement rendering of bricks which had been "corroded" by salt air
- · repainting external walls
- · repainting ground level amenities
- · adjustments to doors, etc
- altering main entrance doors to meet building regulations of opening out.

Club members completed the laying of paving tiles in front of the boatshed.

A fair amount of "tender loving care" by members is still required to bring the Club house back to "A-1" condition.

Expressions of interest were invited from Club members and others to carry out regular cleaning of the main hall. Based on a quotation received, it became clear the Club was not in a position to "pay" someone to undertake weekly cleaning. At the end of the year, some members had volunteered to clean the main hall on a monthly basis.

Proposals to extend the Club house were not progressed; other than tacit agreement the first priority is to provide additional storage and allow disposal of the green container, no firm plan has been developed for the overall future design of the Club building.

A decision was taken by the Management Committee to allocate one-half of the profit from the Club's trading activities to a special building fund. \$3,700 was allocated from the 1996/97 season, and a further amount of \$4,500 will be allocated from this seasons trading. The fund will then stand at \$8,200.

The Club House Committee intends to finalise concept plans for approval by members and Council with the intention of submitting an application for a Government grant early in 1999.




