


Congratulations to all members who gained places in our Point Scores and Club Championships and thanks to Rick Dzopalic for a great job in running these competitions.






Patrol Membership

At the end of the season -

- 88 Bronze Medallion holders undertaking patrols, 72 male and 16 female.
- 103 proficient Bronze Medallion holders.
- 21 U/16 Cadet members undertaking patrols, 14 male and 7 female.
- 22 Cadet members proficient
- 13 Patrols each with an average of 6 Bronze Medallion holders and a minimum of one IRB Driver and one ARC holder
- 53 members (48.6%) recorded 100% patrol attendance



- Rescues 9 persons -
 - 4 without any gear
 - 1 with rescue tube
 - 3 with rescue board
 - 1 with IRB
- Preventative Actions 270 persons warned or directed to safety
- Emergency Care/First Aid treatment -
 - 40 stings (bluebottles, etc)
 - 10 cases minor first aid



Minimum patrol strengths as set by Surf Life Saving Illawarra were achieved on all patrols, and exceeded on all but three patrols.

- 29 September to end-October, and April Sundays and public holidays beach patrolled 10am to 5pm, minimum 3 Bronze holders
- November to mid-December, and February and March – Sundays and public holidays beach patrolled 9am to 5pm, minimum 3 Bronze holders
- Mid-December to end-January Sundays and public holidays beach patrolled 9am to 6pm minimum 4 Bronze Holders; Saturdays beach patrolled 9am to 1pm, minimum 3 Bronze holders.
- Minimum one proficient IRB Driver on each patrol.

Training and Awards

At long last, two new IRB Drivers, our first for three seasons. Along with the IRB Drivers awards, 11 members were trained as IRB Crewpersons.

A fall off in the number of Bronze Medallions gained, but the Club cannot have bumper seasons all the time.

As shown in the graph, there has been a slight fall in the number of awards since last season and an average of 45 awards per season over the last five years. The drop in awards can be attributed slightly to fewer active members and less members turning 15 during the season.

Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate

The Bronze Medallion syllabus and Surf Rescue Certificate syllabus were unchanged from the previous season.

The Club continues to show its success in membership retention with 11 of the 14 Bronze Medallion awards gained by members who have come up through the junior ranks, two new members and one Associate member who thought it was time that he got involved more with the Club.

Surf Rescue Certificate numbers were strong once again and combined with the new Rockie program, the Club gained 12 awards.

The group of instructors once again showed their dedication by putting aside many afternoons and Sunday mornings for training of members. The instructors were Steve Connor, Bill Haran, Peter McDonald, Steven McDonald, Peter O'Halloran, Geoff Ryder, Andrew Taylor, Peter Turner and Bobo White. Their work is very much appreciated and helps lighten my load.

Congratulations to all members who gained their Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate, and thank you to all the instructors.

Advanced Resuscitation Certificate

The syllabus remained unchanged after the last season update, concentrating on Basic Resuscitation, CPR and Advanced Resuscitation. The Club's ARC Workbook was updated this season to match the current training manual.

Eight members gained the award during the offseason. The number of awards is down on last seasons, unfortunately interest in the course seems to have dropped off.

The course has been refined and can be completed in five weeks, and after gaining the Bronze Medallion, the ARC is the next award that should be considered by all members over 15 years.

ARC instructors this season were Peter McDonald, Steven McDonald, Peter O'Halloran and Andrew Taylor.

IRB Drivers Certificate

Congratulations to Grant Dezius and Mark Stares on gaining the IRB Drivers Certificate. These new drivers have come partly as a result of an off-season initiative to start IRB Driver and Crewperson training over the June long weekend.

11 IRB Crewperson Certificates were gained over the 1999 June long weekend.

IRB Instructors put in a great deal of time this season. My thanks go to Graham Cook, Paul Potter and Mark Ryan for their time and enthusiasm.

The goods news is that there are a number of members still in training for the Drivers and Crewpersons Certificates. If you are keen to get involved in IRBs please consider undertaking some training next season

Proficiency Tests

Bronze Medallion/Surf Rescue Certificate

Another slight fall off in numbers on last season proficiencies. The season ended with 125 proficient members, 103 Bronze Medallion and 22 Surf Rescue Certificate. There were 25 female members and 100 male members proficient.

This season's proficiency test consisted of the traditional run-swim-run, one person assessment, tube/board/IRB rescues, and signal and surf awareness questions.

Thanks to Peter Beehag, Evan Griffiths, Jeff Lucke, Peter Turner, Bobo White and all instructors who assisted in running two trouble free Proficiency Tests.

Advanced Resuscitation Certificate

An outstanding season for ARC proficiencies, 44 members in total. This represents 43% of all proficient Bronze Medallion holders.

Evan Griffiths made a significant contribution to these numbers by making himself available for testing most Sunday mornings early in the season. ARC refresher training is still running well with many members presenting themselves for training prior to the proficiency test.

IRB Drivers Certificate

All IRB Drivers renewed their proficiency this season, a total of 21 drivers making themselves available for patrol

A couple of days with the beach closed held up the testing during the season, resulting in most tests being run on an ad-hoc basis to ensure all drivers were tested. Next season, organised proficiency days will be run.



Committee Meetings

Management Committee meetings were scheduled and held monthly commencing August through to May. Meetings were not held in July or June.

This year meetings were held at Helensburgh Workmens Club rather than in the Surf Club and attracted a higher average attendance of committee members than the previous year.

The Executive Committee met formally on four occasions. Matters discussed at these meetings were reported at subsequent meetings of the Management Committee.

The Junior Activities Committee met monthly also at Helensburgh Workmens Club, with Junior Activities delegates reporting regularly to the Management Committee.

Statutory requirements

The Annual Statement as required under the Associations Incorporation Act, 1984 was submitted to the Department of Fair Trading for the 1998/99 year.

The Public Officer was changed in May 2000 to the Secretary, Harley Dreghorn to facilitate lodgement of applications for an Australian Business Number and other paperwork necessary prior to introduction of the GST.

The ABN had not been granted at the time of printing of this report, although the Australian Taxation Office had issued a temporary permit to enable the Club to operate as if it held an ABN:

Affiliation with Surf Life Saving Aust

As approved at the last Annual General Meeting, the Club applied for continuing affiliation with Surf Life Saving Australia.

Asset Register

The documentation and valuation of all Club equipment has progressed, but valuation of most assets still requires to be finalised.

Liquor Licence

The Club continues to maintain a Function Licence for the sale of alcohol for consumption within the Club premises, with the licence held by the Club Secretary, Harley Dreghorn.

The Club has taken advantage of the relaxed licensing regulations for Surf Life Saving Clubs, allowing the sale of alcohol after Club activities at weekends.

Membership Registration

Membership forms were again pre-printed based on information provided by members in the previous season. A computerised database containing extensive details on all current members continues to be maintained and is able to provide statistical and historical information about the Club and its members. The database continues to be managed by Registrar Steven McDonald.

Outstanding payments due from members This year the Club declined to book and pay in advance for accommodation for members attending the Australian Championships as a result of past difficulties in obtaining payment from some members.

At the end of the financial year, there were no outstanding payments due from members other than for membership fees.

Three separate reminders have been sent to individual members recorded as being unfinancial. At the end of the financial year, membership fees were outstanding from 13 patrolling members.

Notices to Members

The Park Bench was issued monthly between August and June, with the Publicity Officer Christine McDonald arranging preparation and issue. The Park Bench was used as a medium to convey official notices to Club members, or such notices were included as inserts.

Youth Development

Following the 1999 Youth Forum organised by Surf Life Saving Illawarra, regular meetings involving young adult members are organised. Andrew Astill continues to represent our Club at Branch level, with this group being active in several initiatives that will undoubtedly attract younger people to stay with Surf Life Saving,

Youth development was also enhanced with the assistance of the Rookie Scheme, with financial and other support provided by Westfields Warrawong. Our Club has benefited greatly from this program with 19 members fully involved.

Thanks to Jeff Lucke for taking the Rookies under his guidance during the year; the sponsorship arrangement from Westfields provided each Rookie with a patrol uniform and general assistance with training to gain the Surf Rescue Certificate.

Club House

Cleaning and maintenance of the Club house continues to be a major issue although thanks to a few volunteer members, cleaning is being carried out on an ad hoc basis and the main hall and amenities are maintained to a reasonable standard.

The current ad hoc cleaning arrangement however does not lend itself to private hiring. Given the difficulties of finding members willing to devote time to cleaning and presentation, the Executive Committee decided to cease private hiring from March 2000 until a workable arrangement is introduced. New positions have been created to address this shortfall from the start of the next year.

Representations have been made to Wollongong Council to tar seal the car park area, and to carry out some maintenance works including attention to the windows in the southern wall of the main hall. These will require replacement and have been listed as a major maintenance item by Council. Tar sealing of the car park seems to have a long term (if ever) priority

Council has also replaced the front doors to the main hall to comply with emergency egress regulations.

No action has been progressed to transfer gear from the storage container into the main part of the boat shed.

Half of the profit raised from refreshment sales has been allocated to the special Building Account fund. At the end of the year, with transfer of a further \$3,200.00 representing half of this years bar profit, the fund stood at \$13,200.00.

Credits

As a result of the competitive skills of Simon Harris in reaching the finals of the Australian Championships, and subsequently winning the Flags event, several references were made about Simon's home club "in the National Park north of Wollongong" by the announcer over national television.

Subsequent follow up stories appeared in the Illawarra Mercury about Simon, his involvement in surf life saving and his involvement in our Club.

A special group of marchers representing the oldest surf life saving clubs was formed to march at the 2000 Australian Championships.

The Executive Committee initially offered this opportunity to Con Asmussen, but he declined in favour of one of our younger members. Simon Harris was elected to march on this occasion, with the announcer providing information about the Club's early history.

The Club probably made world history by having three Club members holding senior referee positions at the World Championships at Manly, having followed on from similar senior postings at past Branch, State and Australian Championships over the last three years. Congratulations to Don Harris, Jeff Lucke and Bob White for their long involvement as senior referees.

Surf Life Saving Illawarra complemented the Club on hosting of the 2000 Illawarra Branch Championships.

At the Branch Presentation Night, our Club was honoured with the selection of David Astill as 2000 Illawarra Branch Junior Volunteer of the Year. Jeff Lucke was also acknowledged as a finalist in the Branch Volunteer of the Year, nominated for his efforts as Rookie Co-ordinator within the Club.

Laura Humphries attended the evening as one of our Rookie members, representing the Club in a draw from the hat for a rescue board.

Steven McDonald reached the finals at State level in Volunteer of the Year award, and Administrator of the Year.

Representation at Branch, State and Australian level of Surf Life Saving

At Branch level, Bobo White held the position of Competition Director, Jeff Lucke, Board of Junior Activities Superintendent, and Evan Griffiths, District Supervisor.

Don Harris was a Branch Vice President, and convenor of the Life Saver of the Year Committee and Volunteer of the Year Committee.

A number of Club members continue to be active within the Board of Life Saving Control, and/or are involved as judges at carnivals within the Illawarra Branch.

Don Harris was a member of the NSW Surf Boat Premiership Panel, and together with Bobo White and Jeff Lucke, held senior judging positions at State, Australian and World championships.

Life Membership Nomination

At the instigation of Evan Griffiths, himself a Life Member of Surf Life Saving Illawarra, the Club submitted a nomination in favour of Ken Sweeney for elevation to Life Membership of the Branch.

The nomination traced Ken's history in Junior Activities back over 20 years when he coached a number of our Club's nipper members at North Wollongong beach in board and swim events.

The nomination was subsequently approved by the Branch, and presented on Branch Presentation Night. Congratulations Ken.

Club activities/functions

In addition to hosting the Branch Championships on 20 February 2000, the club hosted a junior/senior carnival on 13 November, 1999.

Regular Club activities included collection day, participation in the Helensburgh Parade (Junior Activity members), Junior Presentation, Senior Presentation and Patrol Dinner. Most of these functions were held at Helensburgh Workmens Club.

The Winter Swimming group continues to provide an off-season activity for Club members and whether or not you are brave enough to swim on a cold winters morning, the group provides an excellent forum for training and social activities from May to September.

This group also provides an off-season income with its social activities held in the Club house, and has a prime target of taking the Club "into the By running special fund raising community". ventures that do not detract from traditional Club fund raising sources, the winter swim group for some years has provided assistance to the handicapped people from Baringa. With the closure of Baringa two years ago, the winter swim group is now providing assistance to the young adults from CRAM House. Not only do the people from these homes benefit, but so to do our own Club members achieving a high sense of satisfaction and understanding in being able to care for someone less fortunate.

"Keith Mills"

Two years ago the Management Committee decided to christen a surf boat after Keith Mills, a past President and Treasurer of the Club, and a member who put a lot of effort into the early establishment of the Seagulls. The boat required major repairs and is not currently in use.

With the receipt of a new IRB this season, it was decided to christen this craft "Keith Mills", and a formal ceremony took place at the Branch Championships in the presence of Keith's son and Peter Mills.

Finally

Just on 21 years ago, after two years as Assistant Secretary working with Ian Kohlhardt, I took on the position of Hon. Secretary.

I felt safe doing a second term, and even a third term as it seemed unlikely that anyone would ever be interested, or would ever want to, fill the shoes of Con Asmussen with his 24 year record as Secretary/Treasurer.

However there always seemed to be something new happening, like the 75th anniversary, completion of the new Club house, the official opening, new members and new friends, integration with the Juniors, changes to Club Rules as part of becoming an incorporated body, setting up the bar as a profit making enterprise and gaining a Liquor Licence, and so on that kept me interested, and the two or three years has extended on and on.

To suggest in any way the Secretary's job has been a chore, or that I have not enjoyed being a part of the Club, would be grossly incorrect.

In fact, to be able to work with different Presidents, Captains, committees and members towards one common goal – life saving and youth development in our community, has been very gratifying.

I am sure the new Secretary will enjoy the same support and enjoy the same camaraderie that I have over the years.






