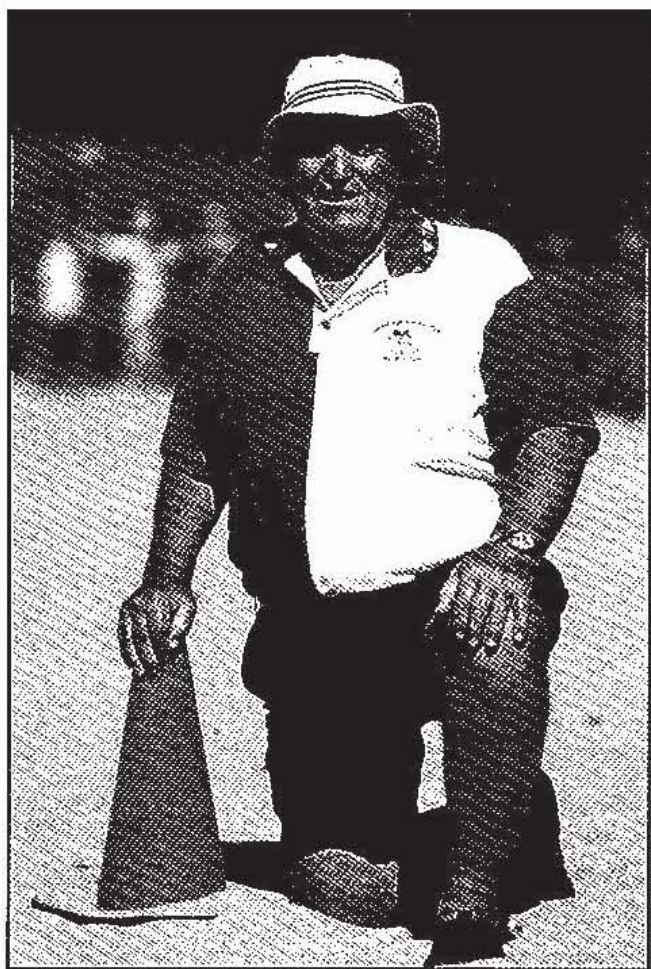

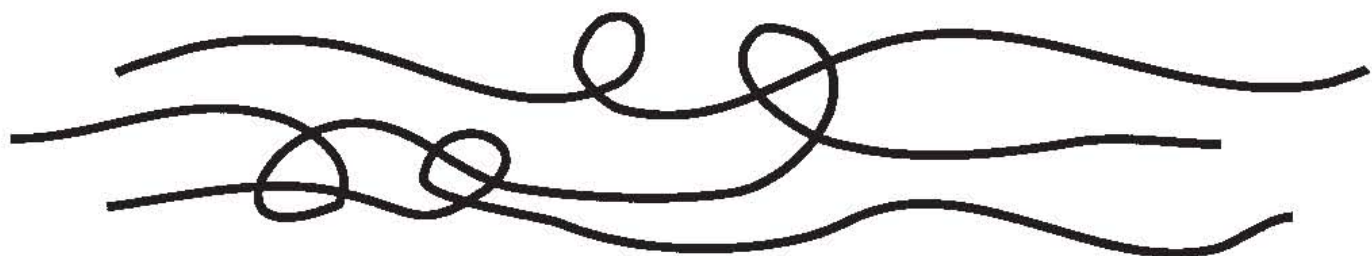

SECRETARYS REPORT

COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Management Committee meetings were scheduled and held monthly throughout the season, with the exception of the month of July. All meetings were conducted at the Helensburgh Workmen's Club and were regularly attended by the committee members.

Three Executive Committee meetings were conducted at the Helensburgh Workmen's Club and one at the Surf Club. Matters arising were reported to the next scheduled Management Committee meeting.

The Junior Activities Committee also met monthly at the Helensburgh Workmen's Club, with the Junior Activities delegates reporting regularly to the Management Committee.

The Stanwell Park Sea Eels Winter Swimming Club, the Ocean Challenge Swim and the Surf Club Reunion Committee conducted unscheduled meetings, also at the Helensburgh Workmen's Club and matters discussed were reported to the next Management Committee.

ASSET REGISTER

The documentation of all Club equipment has been updated, see listing. New equipment acquired this season, a stretcher, two rescue body boards, Yamaha ATV, fuel cabinet, air compressor, eight two-way radios, Tomatsu IRB motor, Achilles IRB hull, five tables, and table tennis table.

Equipment disposed of this season, a Johnson IRB motor, two rescue boards and a refrigerator.

LIQUOR LICENCE

The Club continues to maintain a Function Licence for the sale of alcohol for consumption within the Club premises, Harley Dreghorn holds the licence.

The NSW Courts following objections from other interested bodies declined an application for a new licence with fewer restrictions granted through NSW State Parliament for surf clubs.

The Club registered with the Good Sports Accreditation Program an initiative of the Australian Drug Foundation, to promote the responsible management of alcohol. Two club members acquired their RSA Certificate through the program.

STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

The Annual Statement as required under the Associations Incorporation Act, 1984, was submitted to the Department of Fair Trading for the 2002-2003 year, by Public Officer Harley Dreghorn.

The Child Protection (Prohibited Employment) Act 1998 and the Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998, is current and working effectively within the Club. Debra McCormack is the Child Protection Officer for our Club. All members who assist with this age group are required to sign a Prohibited Employment Declaration Form.

AFFILIATION WITH SURF LIFE SAVING AUSTRALIA

As approved at the last Annual General Meeting, the Club applied for continuing affiliation with Surf Life Saving Australia Limited.

MEMBERSHIP REGISTRATION

Our current membership forms are pre-printed containing information provided by members from the previous season. Upgrading of membership is minimal with only medical and minor changes to be noted. State initiated data system "Complete Patrol Logger" (CPL) caters for membership registration, patrol hours and all Surf Life Saving Awards. Club Registrar, Steven McDonald updates membership information and Patrol Secretary, Lorna Dreghorn inputs Patrol statistics.

COMMUNICATING WITH MEMBERS

Seven editions of the Park Bench were produced with a circulation of 285 copies posted to members, families and supporters of our club. This along with notices included as inserts, remains our best form of communication with Club members. The Club received a donation from Michael Burke this season, which aided costs for four of the monthly circulations. The Junior Activities Committee also produced six newsletters, which were handed out at Sunday Pointscores. Our Publicity Officer Christine McDonald prepares the Park Bench from information provided by Club members and organises the monthly distribution. Feedback from members is very positive, with all members looking forward to receiving the newsletter.

The continuation of the Surf Club website www.stanwellparksurfclub.com has proven to be an asset to the Club and its members providing further information regarding membership, club program and special events and links to other Surf Life Saving websites.

Publicity Officers, Kerrie Blackwell for the JAC section, Geoff Coleman the Senior Club and Steve Clark for the Sea Eels WSC produced many articles for the local newspapers. The efforts of all those involved in publicity for our club is immeasurable and enhances the club's standing within the community.

All of the above sources of communications are only as good as the information provided by members, more input from members would be greatly appreciated.

CLUB HOUSE

Despite a visit by a representative of the Wollongong City Council to address the Surf Club committee regarding the addition of two storage bays there has been no further advancement. WCC has made available \$30,000 as of the 1st July 2004 to help fund the proposal. Not enhancing the clubs cause is the lack of an organised approach to this project.

CHIEF INSTRUCTORS REPORT

TRAINING + AWARDS

This season marks my 15th year as Chief Instructor at "The Park", we have seen a great group of club members obtain many awards and a dedicated band of training officers and assessors guide them through their awards. The club continues to grow each season with increasing knowledgeable award candidates and competent, enthusiastic training officers and assessors.

The season saw the introduction of a new system for gaining surf life saving awards. The new system falls into line with Assessment and Workplace Training courses that are available through TAFE and other registered training organisations. This enables members to gain a qualification that is Nationally recognised and in some case may lead to further employment opportunities in fields other than Surf Life Saving or emergency services. Awards are assessed as candidates progress through their training, so there is no real final exam that the members need to sit, as members become competent in a topic they are assessed and able to move onto the next topic. The good news to all those traditional life savers is that Run-Swim-Run and Resuscitation are still key components of most awards.

Along with the new system also came a new Training Manual, the 32nd Edition, this is written to guide candidates through their awards in conjunction with workbooks, which are completed as part of the award. Workbooks at "The Park" are not new to our members, as the club has been using in-house workbooks for the past 10 years (it is about time the rest of the surf life saving movement caught up!!)

Dealing with all the change, club members gained 37 awards, with ARC and IRBD featuring in our total.

A strong season for the club with 21 Bronze Medallions. Significant change to the process that candidates go through to obtain their Bronze Medallion, so all concerned embarked on a very steep learning curve to achieve the number of Bronze's the club achieved. Not only did the candidates have to contend with the normal training routines, but also they had a group of training officers learning to train under the new assess as you go system.

Despite the changes to the process there were only a small number of changes to the actual content of the Bronze Medallion; the changes were a result of the Bronze becoming a Nationally recognised award. This includes,

- Safety and Wellbeing
- Personal Care
- The Cost of Workplace Illness and Injury
- Occupational Health and Safety
- Causes of Accidents and Illness
- Risk Management

- Lifting and Carrying
- Personal Injury
- Stress Reactions
- , Debriefing
- Physical Health and Fitness

The successful completion of 21 Bronze Medallions must also be attributed to the group of training officers who looked after 2 rather large squads. They adopted and managed the new system extremely well; extra special mention to Bobo White who effectively ran the training and paperwork side of the Bronzes, making the introduction of the new system relatively painless. The remaining training officers/assessors included Peter McDonald, Geoff Ryder, Steven McDonald and Shannon Cummings.

SURF RESCUE CERTIFICATE

A small age group coming through from the Seagulls resulted in 6 new life savers going onto patrols this season. This group will be the last to go and gain their SRC under the old system. From next season the SRC will form the prerequisite for the Bronze Medallion and enable Bronze Medallion to be gained in a shorter period of time as the skills learned in the SRC will be recognised for the Bronze Medallion.

The members trained in the Run-Swim-Run, Resuscitation, Basic First Aid, Signals, Patrols, Surf Skills and Rescue Techniques.

Again Geoff Ryder and Peter McDonald trained candidates twice weekly, battling against time to ensure that they meet the deadline for candidates to COMPETE at the Inter-branch Championships. Due to the dedication of the clubs training officers, the candidates underwent further training after they had successfully

gained their award, ensuring the candidates had the necessary skills to go onto patrols for the club. Shannon Cummings also assisted with the training of the candidates.

ADVANCED RESUSCITATION CERTIFICATE (ARC)

After a season with no new ARC's the club has 4 new ARC holders, strengthening the clubs patrol capability. Evan Griffiths dedicated his Sunday mornings to training the new ARC holders, thanks "Old Griffo".

There were no significant changes to the ARC this season. The ARC is also becoming a Nationally recognised award; it will be completed with the assistance of workbooks and continuous assessment. The basic award will not change as it will still focus on expanding resuscitation practices and include the application of the airbag resuscitator, spinal neck brace and OP airways.

PROFICIENCY TESTS

Two main proficiency test days is still working well for the club, it seems favourable for most members, and fortunately the seas were kind enabling the tests to go ahead as scheduled. No changes to the physical components of the test, Run-Swim-Run, Rescues and Resuscitation. There was the addition for this season of an update to the awards to bring Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate holders into line with the 32nd Edition Training Manual. The update was completed by all proficient members in groups on the Proficiency Test days or on patrol. The update included OH&S, working as a team, communication and the use of oxygen therapy.

Proficiency testing was also conducted for IRB Drivers and Crewpersons and

Research into blue bottle stings is continuing, with trials into using warm/hot water taking place elsewhere. Until research is completed the current (and generally effective) use of ice packs is still the treatment of choice.

Thanks to Assured Service Industries we have a new fridge with a much larger freezer capacity, so running out of ice will not be an option.

The generous support of PRD Nationwide Reality Helensburgh, along with the Surf Club Reunion, has allowed continuing maintenance and improvements to our First Aid equipment.

One of our Oxy-vivas required major servicing in the off-season to replace an important part which had passed its used by date.

Stanwell Tops Conference Centre has generously provided funding for a rescue blanket, which will be available for the new season. This will assist in moving patients off the beach.

Thanks also to patrolling members who continue to keep the First Aid Room clean and have minimised the amount of sand brought in by brushing down equipment prior to returning it.

The overall winner was Ben Allen of North Wollongong (son of well-known Illawarra SLS Official Dennis Allen) in a time of 28.08min. A new race record! The first female home was Skye Hennes of Woonona in 33.28min.

Our club was represented by 15 swimmers who went very well indeed. The first club person home, winning the "Brin Thompson Trophy" was again David Whiteside of Helensburgh in a time of 33.34min. It was encouraging to see some of our younger senior members having a go. Well Done!

Our neighbouring club of Coalcliff was well represented with 9 swimmers. The first of these home being Fiona Hunt in a time of 34.58 minutes, which earned her 1st place in the Masters Female category.

This year we were able to plot the course with a GPS. This means we can replicate the exact course each year (subject to surf conditions) thus ensuring consistency from year to year. SECRETARYS REPORT

Winter Swimming aims to promote the camaraderie of Surf Life Saving and the maintenance of swimming fitness throughout the winter months. There is also the chance to strut one's stuff at home and abroad in some pretty breath-taking places and poses. This is good for both our own self-esteem and justification, and for rattling those lesser mortals who can't drag themselves from the warm embrace of their loved ones on a winter's Sunday morning.

We are in a strong financial position, have met our stated goals and have provided many new and existing swimmers with achievable challenges. All of these activities are good for our youngsters and for those of CRAM House, the adults who swim, and our communities.

68 members commenced the 2003 season, our fifteenth with two Associates and 66 active swimmers, some more actively swimming than others. On the 18 Sunday morning swims, we averaged 40 swimmers. Overall, 10 swimmers gained 100% attendance. It is pleasing to see one Under 18 swimmer and one Under 14 swimmer (a fresh eel to boot), getting 100% attendance. We also increased our quota over previous years on our Bring-A-Friend Day, even snaring an international friend.

We still have an unbroken record of fielding a team at every titles contested over the 15 seasons since the club's inception. Last season, the Sea Eels finished second overall in the Championships of the South Coast Winter Swimming Association. We are the hosts of that Championship this year. For such a small and relatively young

club, we showed off the depth of our swimming talent at the Winter Swimming Championships of Australia. Our swimmers made it into several individual finals and three relay finals, finishing fifth overall in the over-40s. We did much better in the timed 10-man relay than in recent years, but still leaving room for improvement. We ended up with 3 points, a 300% improvement over the previous championships!
