Members,

The 101st Annual Report which covers our Centenary or 100th year of surf life saving is presented for your consideration and adoption. The report includes financial statements for the year ended 31 May 2008.

The 2007/08 year has been a very successful one and has ended with probably our highest ever membership.

Our patrol members achieved their primary objective of No Lives Lost during rostered patrol hours at Stanwell Park beach, and were pro-active in promoting surf safety and surf awareness during patrols.

Training and development of members continued with 44 awards gained, ensuring that trained and proficient lifesavers with skills in resuscitation and IRB operation were available for beach patrols.

This year a record number (193) of junior lifesavers from age 5 to 14 attended the beach on Sunday mornings to learn about water safety, surf awareness and gain experience in a beach environment that will facilitate their eventual graduation to become lifesavers.

Members and friends celebrated a great milestone in our history – 100 years, and special events were scheduled throughout the year to mark the occasion.

Our members were again active in the community, visiting the four local primary schools to talk to students about surf awareness and water safety generally.

Members ran a surf awareness and resuscitation display at the Helensburgh Fair and a large contingent took part in the Fair parade. Members participated in a parade in Wollongong as part of 2007 Year of the Surf Lifesaver, and the unveiling of a bronze statue at North Wollongong to recognise surf lifesavers in the Illawarra.

In March the Club hosted the annual Coalcliff to Stanwell Park ocean swim with almost 300 swimmers, and our winter swimmers again facilitated a day out for the patients from CRAM House at Helensburgh Workmens Club. In April, our members participated in a breast cancer awareness event "Petals on the Water" with two boat crews on Sydney Harbour.

The year ended on a high note on Saturday evening 28 June with the announcement of the award of "Illawarra Surf Life Saving Club of the Year" an award that has come to Helensburgh-Stanwell Park now four years out of the six it has been awarded as part of Surf Life Saving Illawarra's annual Awards of Excellence.

Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving Club Inc (the Surf Club) became an incorporated association on 3 April 1995 under the provisions of the *Associations Incorporation Act 1984* (NSW), registered number Y2151644. The Surf Club includes the Junior section and Winter Swimming group.

Through affiliation with Surf Life Saving NSW Inc, the Surf Club holds authority under the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991* (NSW) to conduct charitable fundraising activities; Licence No 11033, valid from 6 May 2004 until 5 May 2009.

The Surf Club has been registered with the ATO for GST since 1 July 2000.

The Surf Club has been endorsed by the Australian Tax Office to access the following tax concessions

- Income Tax Exemption from 1 July 2000 under Sub-Division 50-B of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*
- GST concessions from 1 July 2005 under Division 176 of *A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999*
- FBT Exemption from 1 July 2005 under Section 123C of the *Fringe Benefits Tax Assessment Act 1986*

The Surf Club has been endorsed by the Australian Tax Office from 1 July 2000 as a Deductible Gift Recipient under the provisions of Sub-Division 30-B of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*

The Stanwell Park Surf Club building is owned and maintained by Wollongong City Council. Other than Council lifeguards whilst on duty, the Surf Club is the sole occupier of the building with the consent of Council and accepts responsibility for its day to day management and security.

Centenary Year Committee Report

The 2007/08 season has been one in which we celebrated 100 years of Surf Life Saving at Stanwell Park beach. This important milestone is not something to be taken for granted. It is an honour we can all share in, having been a part of an organisation that has given 100 years of service to the community

To celebrate our centenary several key events were organised by a small but dedicated anniversary committee. It was decided to have a stall at the annual Lions Club Fair to show the public and our sponsors what we do with the money that they kindly donate. Our display looked great and was a credit to our club. This led into a large number of members taking part in the street parade, proudly marching and representing Helensburgh-Stanwell Park SLSC.

In December an invitation was sent to all members to gather at the beach and take part in an event billed as the 'Big Patrol'. The plan was to have as many active members as possible signed onto patrol at the one time and for an aerial photograph to be taken of the formation. In all we had 130 members dressed in the red and yellow patrol uniform vigilantly watching over our beach. Approximately 150 of our Nippers were involved by positioning themselves on the sand to form '100 YEARS'. What resulted was a great photo that will long be a part of our Club's history.

The major celebration of our Club's centenary was held over the weekend of the 16th and 17th of February 2008 and what a weekend it turned out to be. The Dinner/Dance held in the Grand Ballroom of the Novotel at Wollongong was a sensational evening that showcased our Club in a brilliant light to the 330 people who were fortunate enough to have been in attendance. From the opening '1908' visual story line produced by Brendon Potter to the entertainment provided by "One Hit Wonders", the evening quickly passed by leaving everyone wanting it not to end.

In between there were excellent speakers who spoke proudly of our great Club and its contribution to surf life saving in New South Wales and indeed Australia. Those in attendance will never forget the proud words delivered by our own Con Asmussen, MBE in particular his declaring of us "The Greatest Club of All". Lifesaving and Patrols

Hello everyone, another great season was had this year, our 100th. Once again I'd like to thank all patrol members who gave up their time to patrol "our strip of sand" and especially those who gained their 100% patrol attendance, thank you.

Our patrol obligations as set out in our Lifesaving Service Agreement with Surf Life Saving NSW for the 2007-08 season were all fulfilled. These requirements were:

- Patrol of Stanwell Park beach each Sunday and public holiday from Sunday 30 September 2007 until Sunday 27 April 2008.
- Patrol from 9.00 am to 5.00 pm, and extended hours to 6.00 pm from 26 December 2007 until 27 January 2008
- Provide a minimum of three Bronze Medallion holders on each patrol, with each patrol having a least one ARC holder, one IRB driver and one IRB crew person and one defibrillation operator.
- Early in 2008, Wollongong City Council decided that Stanwell Park beach should be treated as a tourist beach and our season was extended through to the June long weekend, with patrols concluding on Monday 9 June 2008

Our patrols achieved and exceeded these minimum requirements on every patrol. Every patrol had an average of ten Bronze Medallion holders rostered on with an average of six Bronze holders in attendance each patrol.

Thanks to those patrol members who took on extra training and gained additional qualifications, with ARC, IRB Drivers, IRB Crewpersons and Defibrillation operators needed on all patrols.

Thank you also to the Patrol Captains for the additional responsibilities which they readily accepted and performed in a professional manner. Patrol Captains were Kieran Beaumont, Andrew Perrin, Carl Williams, Steven McDonald, Stuart Brandman, Russell White, Dave Astill and Dave O'Grady.

Our patrols ran so well this year because of a few other members who took on extra roles and made my job that bit easier, my thanks to them. They are:-

- √ Nathan Thompson, Vice Captain, helped whenever I was unavailable, and contributed on all matters regarding patrols.
- √ Sandra Dent, Patrol Secretary, who helped Nathan and myself with the mountain of paperwork involved these days and kept patrol records up to date.
- √ Peter McDonald, Chief Instructor, and his team of trainers, for providing the patrols with new Bronze Medallion holders and Surf Lifesaving Cadets, and ensuring that a high standard was always maintained.

- √ Mark Stares, IRB Captain, for ensuring IRB's and IRB motors were always available for patrols and that the quad bike was always in good working order.
- √ Peter O'Halloran, Radio Officer, for maintaining our hand held and base radios.
- √ Geoff Coleman, Chief First Aid Officer, for ensuring the first aid equipment was checked regularly, first aid boxes were always well stocked and maintained and the first aid room was always kept clean and ready to deal with any first aid problems.
- √ Evan Griffiths, for under taking patrol inspections and running the patrol competition.
- √ And finally the Club Executive, for the support they have given Nathan and myself with any matters that have risen concerning the patrols.

Our Lifesavers this year, apart from their patrol obligations, also gave up willingly their spare time to provide water safety and assistance for Junior and Senior carnivals, the Stanwell Park Ocean Challenge and the nippers on most Sunday mornings. Well done to those people.

This year our Club was going through a transitional phase, with a lot of older, experienced members retiring from patrols (and many thanks for their years of service), and a lot of younger, eager members joining patrols. So at the start of the season, Nathan, Sandra, Peter Mac and I sat down and tried to come up with a suitable blend of youth and experience for each patrol, so that the older, experienced members were there to impart their years of wisdom and skills onto the younger members. The results speak for themselves with a good blend of personnel and a good overall patrol season.

Two major incidents occurred this year for our patrol members to deal with.

The first was a car over the cliffs at the southern end of the beach, nobody was in the car but our patrol members, lead by Patrol Captain Stuart Brandman and PJ Bedwell, spent a lot of time assisting the Police, Ambulance and Hazmat team from the Fire Brigade.

The second really put our patrol members and our hours of training to the test, and fortunately, it took place right when there was a change over of patrols so there was effectively two full patrols on the beach to handle the situation.

A hang-glider went into the water off the rocks at the northern end of the beach, the pilot was badly injured and was getting washed on to rocks; a board rider who was close to the scene got to him first and took him out into clear water just as the IRB arrived. On returning to shore with the patient, the IRB Driver and Patrol Captain Kieran Beaumont, made a quick assessment of the injured man and signalled to the beach for assistance required.

By the time Kieran had reached the beach, Dave O'Grady the afternoon Patrol Captain and myself were there to offer assistance, but while we were attending to this rescue, a large gentleman fell over and badly broke his leg in all really packed flags area.

The Air Rescue Service was called in to air lift out the badly injured hang-glider pilot and the Ambulance was called in to take away the gentleman with the badly broken leg.

Both patrols performed above and beyond their duties, everybody had their part to play and everything was done in an efficient and professional manner. The helicopter pilot even commented to the Ambulance service that he was very impressed with the professional manner in which our patrols conducted themselves and in their handling of the situation and the public.

This year a new award was introduced for our patrol members; it is the High Patrol Achievement Award.

In the past, we have only had one award for Patrol Person of Year, but this only recognised the outstanding achievement of one person among so many other patrol members who do so much for the Club on the beach. The High Patrol Achievement Award will allow another member or members to be recognised but will only be awarded when someone really stands out as a high achiever. I have introduced this award just to let all those other great patrol members know that your efforts do not go unnoticed.

This year our Patrol Person of the Year was Stephanie McGuinness, a very deserving winner and the first lady in our 100 year history to win this award.

Nathan, Sandra and I could not separate these two young men, and their efforts were tremendous, so this year the High Achievement Award went to both Ben Dowling and Josh Dent.

68 people achieved 100% patrol attendance, a very good result, and the highest the Club has ever achieved, and in my opinion, the highest achievement the Club has to offer. I would also like to thank "Hilti" for sponsoring this award and for supplying the hooded jackets, and thanks also to Don Burke for helping to secure this valued support.

Again this year, apart from our commitment to patrol Stanwell Park beach, the Club also had an obligation to provide 24-hour search and rescue support to the Police, providing rescue support up into the Royal National Park and providing assistance if needed, to our neighbouring clubs to the south, all of which is carried out by a handful of members whose names and numbers are registered with rescue services.

Mark Stares, IRB Captain reported the IRBs had been reliable and available for service at all times.

Aaron Wallace and Chris Ryder took on the positions of IRB Vice Captains in a joint role and gained much experience as well as providing good support in ensuring IRBs were available for patrols. Their assistance was very much appreciated.

One of the IRBs acquired in 2001 was due for replacement.

The current feeling amongst members appeared to be not to acquire a replacement IRB, but to obtain a jet ski instead. A jet ski seemed to be more appropriate to Stanwell Park's conditions and would be a chance for the Club to move forward with more modern equipment.

If this does proceed, a training schedule will be required and should proceed during the off season, so that the Club does not finish up with a space shuttle with no astronauts. The thoughts of all patrol members and commitments to train as jet ski operators needs to be understood so that the Committee can make the correct decision.

A special thank you to patrol captains and patrol teams for their efforts in looking after our equipment.

Patrol Highlights:

- √ 96 Bronze Medallion holders doing patrols.
- √ 13 Active Reserves and Long Service Members attending and supporting our patrols
- √ 13 Cadets, U15's.
- √ 8 patrols, each with an average of 11 Bronze Medallion holders and a minimum of 1 IRB Driver, 1 IRB Crewman, 2 ARC holders and 1 Defibrillation operator.
- √ Among the 8 patrols and Active Reserves we have 52 ARC holders and 13 IRB drivers.
- √ 68 patrol members gained 100% patrol attendance, this is a very good achievement.

Operational Statistics:

Patrols members rescued 11 people: -

- 9 people by rescue board
- 2 people by IRB

Preventive action was taken to guide 90 people to a safer area to swim

First Aid treatment was rendered to 9 people

Ambulance was called for 5 people

Call outs to assist search and rescue by other services on 3 occasions

Patrol Defaults: Surf Life Saving Illawarra recorded a total of 60 demerit points against our patrols for the 2007-08 season, all of which were for late radio patrol log on, this over all was a very good result.

Patrol Audit: Surf Life Saving NSW undertook a patrol audit during February 2008 to confirm that Club members entered for the State Championships had in fact completed sufficient hours to compete during 2007, and were not in patrol default. 

A combination of our experienced trainers and our fully implemented training aids (computer, data projector and screen) ensured another successful awards season with training.

Forty four awards were achieved by our members this season

Training for the theory side of Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificates again commenced before the start of the season with most candidates qualified and on the beach patrolling by the end of December.

Thankfully the Club again had a number of experienced, qualified trainers and assessors to call on. This combined with a support crew of water safety, including the WCC Lifeguards during mid-week training sessions, our trainers willing to take up some of the work load and some well maintained training equipment made the task that much easier.

Bronze Medallions (PUA21004 Certificate II in Public Safety [Aquatic Rescue])

Bobo White, Geoff Ryder, Tanya Potter, Evan Griffiths and Peter McDonald conducted the Bronze Medallion training for 13 candidates. A rewarding aspect was that six candidates were parents of Junior members and helped boost patrol numbers as well as providing water safety for the Juniors.

Two other members completed the theory side of their Bronze Medallion and after gaining more confidence in the surf will return next season to successfully complete their qualification.

It was pleasing to be able to train another exchange student Monika Albers from Germany, who was successful in gaining her Bronze Medallion and performed patrols before she returned home proud of her achievement.

Bronze Medallion candidates were assessed as they progressed through each topic outlined in the 32nd Edition Training Manual, completing a workbook and a final written exam of 20 questions.

On the practical side, the traditional Run-Swim-Run and Resuscitation continue to be key components combined with a rescue scenario and for new members a compulsory four hour on the job training with experienced patrol members.

Dave Winner of Coalcliff SLSC being a Certificate IV Assessor conducted the written exam and ensured that all administrative procedures had been followed for both the Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate courses.

Surf Rescue Certificates (CPR Endorsed)

Evan Griffiths and Peter McDonald were responsible for training of the three Surf Rescue candidates, one being a new member, the others continuing on from the Junior Section.

The Surf Rescue Certificate is now of the same competency based training system as the Bronze Medallion, with the final result being that Surf Rescue Certificate holders will only have to complete a few modules to gain their Bronze Medallion.

Advanced Resuscitation Certificate

Five members successfully gained their ARC thanks to trainers Evan Griffiths and Peter McDonald. Again the practice of encouraging members who as they gain their Bronze Medallions to keep training and qualify for the Advanced Resuscitation Certificate was continued.

Dave O'Grady, Life Member and one of our more experienced lifesavers, was finally convinced to gain this very important certificate this year.

Patrols now have the "luxury" of having an average of seven ARC holders on each patrol.

Defibrillation Certificate

Dave Winner (Coalcliff SLSC) conducted a well presented Defibrillation course at Stanwell Park for 13 of our members and another seven members from other clubs. Within our Club 28 members now hold this certificate, giving each patrol an average of three qualified Defibrillator operators. With on-going support from Surf Life Saving Illawarra, other members will be trained in the use of the defibrillators and gain their Defibrillation Certificate.

Special congratulations to Nathan Johnston, although visually impaired showed a high degree of competency in attaining his certificate.

Silver Medallion IRB Drivers

Thank you once again to Murray Dowling who took the initiative to train IRB Drivers. Murray with the help of experienced drivers was on-hand to prep the IRB and put the members through various training exercises.

Eight members gained their Silver Medallion IRB Driver, with another three female drivers within our Club; congratulations to all of these members. This group strengthened the Club's IRB crew contingent supplying a majority of patrols with up to three drivers.

Enthusiasm is building once again in the IRB ranks and hopefully some of these members will revive the IRB competition scene and gain further experience in these important rescue crafts.

Spinal Management Certificate

As part of the Illawarra Education meetings, those in attendance were put through the Spinal Management course. The main emphasis was the use of the spinal board with speed blocks (head movement restraints) and belts to prevent body movement.

Courses will be run for members once all clubs have been issued with these accessories.

Training and Assessing

Proficiency Tests

The club held two mass proficiency test days under the control of Evan Griffiths, Geoff Ryder, Bobo White and Peter McDonald for both the Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate holders. This catered for the majority of members. One hundred and fourteen members were proficient for the 2007/08 season.

Advanced Resuscitation Certificate proficiency and the resuscitation component of the BM and SRC proficiency was conducted during patrols, an initiative of Evan Griffiths, that made sure all members were suitably proficient in this important role. Sixty four members were proficient in ARC for the 2007/08 season.

IRB drivers and crewpersons were deemed proficient via demonstrations of competency during their operational activities on patrols and whilst providing water safety for both the seniors and juniors activities and during award assessments.

A number of active members completed their All Terrain Vehicle (ATV) Operator Induction Accreditation.

Surf Education Awards

A new initiative introduced into the Junior Section was the staging of four Twilight Point Scores conducted specifically for surf education. Juniors were educated in beach, club and patrol familiarisation, as well as learning about rips, waves, surf skills, basic first aid and resuscitation. This was made possible by involving our patrol members to instruct individual age groups.

This proved very successful and was appreciated by the school principals.

Conclusion

Our Club was well represented by trainers at the Education Meetings conducted by the Illawarra Branch.

Evan Griffiths' expertise in competition for Rescue and Resuscitation (R&R) along with Peter McDonald was called upon by ex-member of our club, Mikayla Morris, now with Bulli to update her to a competitive level on R&R to contest the Champion Life Saver event at the State Titles. Mikayla finished a commendable fourth.

Thanks to Dave Winner from Coalcliff for conducting the Defibrillation course and assessing our Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate candidates, and to Barry Allen who assessed and oversaw the training of our IRB Driver Certificates.

Congratulations to all members who gained awards or kept proficient to ensure Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving Club is a strong patrolling club, highly recognised by the Illawarra Branch.

To all who assisted, it was greatly appreciated.

The Club's affairs are controlled and managed by the Management Committee, with officers elected annually by Club members at the Annual General Meeting.

The Executive Committee comprises some of the officers of the Management Committee as shown on page 2 of this report. The Executive deals with urgent matters arising between Management Committee meetings, sensitive matters and other matters referred by the Management Committee, reporting decisions to the next Management Committee meeting.

The Junior section operates as a sub-committee reporting to the Management Committee. The Junior section is generally run by the Junior Activities Committee, comprising officers elected annually by Club members.

The winter swimming group, Stanwell Park Sea Eels also operates as a sub-committee but on day to day matters runs autonomously. The group elects its committee from Club members as well as fellow members from Coalcliff SLSC but principally those members interested in and participating in winter swimming. The winter swimming group reports regularly on financial and other matters to the Management Committee.

Executive Committee

Formal meetings were held on 14 November 2007, 20 February 2008, 12 March 2008, 27 April 2008, 22 June 2008 and 15 July 2008 as well as some ad hoc meetings.

Matters discussed at these meetings included consultations with Wollongong City Council about the Club building, options to fund the 100 Year History Book, allocation of carnival prizes, refunds to guests who withdrew from the Centenary Dinner, allocation of subsidies to competitors, selection of nominees for Illawarra Awards of Excellence, selection of Club Member of the Year, management and structure of the Junior section, and issues relative to the Junior section accounting.

A second meeting was also held on 27 April 2008 to discuss the awarding of trophies by the Junior section. Following this the Executive convened a meeting with the Junior Activities executive and subsequently individual members to discuss matters they wished to raise, some relative to the awarding of trophies and other general matters about the Junior section.

The Executive reported on the outcome of all meetings to the next Management Committee meeting.

Special General Meetings

A meeting was held on Sunday 30 March 2008 to elect officers to the Junior section for 2008/09 year.

Management Committee

Met monthly (except in October, March and June) to deal with correspondence, monitor income and expenditure, approve payment of accounts, and receive reports from Club officers.

Some members not elected to the Management Committee often attended committee meetings and brought forward new ideas and raised other matters of concern to the membership in general. Whilst voting at the Management Committee meetings was restricted to the elected officers, the committee welcomed the attendance and input of these members.

The Committee appointed members to vacant positions of Assistant Secretary, IRB Captain and IRB Vice Captain during the year. The position of Assistant Treasurer remained vacant.

Junior Activities Committee

The Junior Activities Committee generally met on a monthly basis up until 10 April 2008. As a result of three Junior section office bearers standing down after that time, the Club President and Club Secretary took on the role in an interim basis of Chairperson and Secretary respectively of the Junior section.

Meetings were held on 19 June 2008 and 3 July 2008 to plan for 2008/09 season, with a further meeting scheduled for 24 July 2008.

Nominations to fill the vacant positions will be invited at the Annual General Meeting on 3 August 2008.

Winter Swim Group (Stanwell Park Sea Eels)

The Sea Eels continued to function as an autonomous committee on day to day matters, and submitted reports on its financial affairs and activities to the Management Committee on a regular basis.

Membership Development

The program was aimed to develop their leadership skills, assist them in supporting the personal development of other members, and promoting team work and communication skills.

Club officers attended a SLSI conference on 17th August 2007 for an update on SLS NSW initiatives and launching of a new SLS NSW Club guide.

Membership Recruitment

Peter McDonald organised a program of visits to the four local primary schools during September 2007.

In company with Laura Humphries they addressed students about surf awareness and surf safety, the benefits of joining the surf club and how to become involved.

Injuries to members

Four Club members suffered injury whilst undertaking surf life saving activities during the year.

Three of these members sought re-imbusement of medical expenses incurred from the NSW Government Emergency and Rescue Workers Compensation Fund, whilst the fourth sought to record the injury.

Membership Fees

An unusually high number of members had not paid their fees by mid-October 2007. Efforts to follow up the unfinancial members were hampered when it was found that some receipts did not clearly specify payments were for fees. Action was taken to rectify this and procedures for writing receipts and other accounting matters were now being enforced.

Membership fees will not be increased for the 2008/09 year.

Invoices for fees will be issued during August 2008.

Membership Forms

It is an SLSA requirement that members complete the SLSA Membership form each year. Whilst it was member's responsibility to correctly complete the forms and lodge them with the Club, the Club's internal procedures were not strong enough to quickly identify members who had not lodged their form. A more practicable process to rectify this will be considered mid-August.

Welfare of Members – Member Protection Policy

To promote Surf Clubs and Club activities as a safe place for younger people, SLSA and SLS NSW promote a "Working with Children Check" which in NSW requires members who may come in contact with younger people in a sports environment to sign a Prohibited Employment Declaration and Consent Form.

This program was again actively supported by the Club, with Paul Potter being the Club's nominated Child Protection Co-ordinator.

Complaints and Grievances

One member sought assistance regarding the incorrect allocation of a trophy this year. This matter was satisfactorily resolved with the member by the Club Executive as was a similar one from another member.

Letters were received from three individual members who asked the Club Executive to address some matters within the Junior section.

A letter was received from a fourth member who suggested a decision made by the Club Executive was not satisfactory.

A letter was received from a fifth member who believed some comments made by other members regarding Junior section matters were incorrect.

After considering the comments contained in the five letters mentioned above and the fact that three members had stood down from their positions since mid-April 2008, the Club Executive decided the best way forward was for the vacant positions to be advertised and filled at the Club AGM.

New procedures were also deemed necessary or existing procedures needed to be strengthened to address concerns that came to light as a result of these letters being received.

A Code of Conduct for Club Officers and a second Code for Club members generally will also be introduced and promoted to all members as the Club's policy (in line with SLSA policy) of what we expect from our members.

The Park Bench June 2008 issue contained a further request to all members to follow correct procedures if they had a complaint or grievance.

Publicity

Regular reports were provided by Julie Humphries to the two local monthly publications.

Media releases were sent by Harley Dreghorn to various newspapers about The Big Patrol, the Centenary weekend, and the achievement of gaining Surf Life Saving Club of the Year.

The Big Patrol and the Centenary weekend appeared in the Illawarra Mercury, the Wollongong Advertiser, Northern Leader, and St George Leader, whilst Surf Life Saving Club of the Year appeared in the Illawarra Mercury. ABC Illawarra radio 97.3 ran interviews about the Centenary weekend and Club of the Year.

Peter McDonald sent media releases to local, Wollongong and Sydney newspapers about the Stanwell Park Ocean Challenge with good response.

Opportunity was taken to utilise the new Helensburgh community sign at the end of Parkes Street to advantage, with promotion of registration days, Lifesavers Appeal Day, announcement of our Club's 100th birthday, the Centenary Re-union and Ocean Challenge.

Special thanks to Helensburgh Lions Club for their foresight in providing this sign at the doorway to Helensburgh, and our thanks for their assistance in supporting our Club's activities.

Community activities

Stanwell Park Sea Eels again hosted the intellectually disabled young people from Cram House in Wollongong to a day out at Helensburgh Bowling Club (although because of bad weather it ended up at Helensburgh Workmens Club) during August. Supporting these young people has been on-going for eight years.

Peter McDonald and Laura Humphries visited four local primary schools and spoke with students about surf awareness and surf safety.

Paul Potter, Tanya Potter, Brendon Potter, Peter McDonald and Jim Powell hosted a display at the Helensburgh Fair on Saturday 27 October 2007. Club equipment was displayed with members demonstrating resuscitation techniques and generally promoting surf awareness and surf safety and our role at Stanwell Park beach.

Club members later participated in strength at the Helensburgh Fair Parade.

A Trivia Night at Helensburgh Workmens Club on 3 November 2007 attracted members of the community to a Surf Club activity, and was a well organised fund raising night for competitors.

200 students from Heathcote High School and Blayney High School were hosted to a "beach day" at Stanwell Park Surf Club and beach on 11 December 2007 providing students with an insight into surf awareness and surf safety and the role of a surf life saving club

An Open Day invitation to the Surf Club on Sunday 24 February 2008 did not attract a great deal of interest from the local community.

The Stanwell Park Ocean Challenge was well promoted and attracted a record number of entries for the 30 March 2008 community event.

On Sunday 11 May 2008, a memorial service was held near the Sydney Opera House in conjunction with the Mothers Day Classic Walk for Breast Cancer held at the Botanical Gardens. The Lady Hopetoun of the Sydney Vintage Fleet carried 25 breast cancer survivors from the Pittwater Pinks Dragon Boat Club accompanied by a fleet of surf boats.

Once they heard about this activity, our boat crews decided to participate, with the Open Ladies crew and U/23 ladies crew with sweeps Don Burke and Brendan MacAlpine, representing not only Helensburgh-Stanwell Park club but the overall South Coast region.

Our two surf boats were launched at Rose Bay and rowed to the Opera House with 20 other surfboats from clubs throughout NSW where they met up with the Lady Hopetoun with the Pinkwater Pinks Ladies on board. As the surf boats circled the Lady Hopetoun a service was held for the people who had sadly lost their fight for survival through breast cancer. A moment of silence was held with oars held upright and hundreds of petals scattered on the water, followed by a spectacular siren and water salute.

This was a special, proud and emotional moment for the boat crews and special thanks and appreciation to those who participated in "Petals on the Water" and gave up their time on their own Mothers Day to support this event.

Statutory Reports

Annual Statement for Incorporated Associations

The Annual Statement for 2007/08 financial year, as required by the *Associations Incorporations Act 1984* was approved by members at the Annual General Meeting held on 22 July 2007, and submitted to the Office of Fair Trading on 16 August 2007.

OH&S

A complete inspection of the Club building and equipment is scheduled to be undertaken before the end of September 2008 to ensure all risks have been identified and mitigation strategies applied.

Environmental management

Refuelling of IRBs and the quad bike within the boat shed area has been identified as an environmental risk. Similar to previous years, the risk continued to be mitigated by the availability of a spill kit located in the boat shed, and briefing of IRB crews and patrol members on their duty of care when refuelling.

Exemption was again granted by Sydney Water allowing the use of water for life saving operational activities outside normal restrictions. This exemption was monitored to ensure it was not abused by Club members.

Food business notification

Notification and registration of the Club as the operator of a food business (dispensing of drinks and preparation and sale of food items) was forwarded to the NSW Food Authority in October 2004 and is still current.

Asset Register

The Asset Register was maintained on a computer database and was updated to effect changes. A summary of the Register is included in this report.

Liquor Licence

The Club continues to hold a Function Licence issued in the name of Harley Dreghorn (Licence no 24003604). Eight members who hold Responsible Service of Alcohol Certificates were qualified to serve alcoholic beverages.

The Licensing Court endorsed all applications to conduct functions during the year. Notification was sent to the Licensing Court, Police and Wollongong City Council of dates approved by the Management Committee to conduct "Coldies" functions following patrols, point score, and other Club activities. No incidents relating to the Liquor Licence were recorded during the year.

A "self assess" audit requested by the Office of Liquor Gaming and Racing during November 2007 found that the conditions of the Licence were being followed and that all necessary signs were in place.

The new *Liquor Act 2007* and the *Liquor Regulation 2008* apply from 1 July 2008. The new Act continues to recognise "Coldies" functions for surf clubs and in addition will allow private functions to be held in the Club premises subject to a number of conditions first being met. This includes endorsement of the arrangements by Wollongong City Council and will probably require the Surf Club to develop a Community Impact Statement. The Management Committee will deal with this over the next few months.

Insurance

Insurance policies covering fire and burglary of Club equipment whilst within the Surf Club, as well as policies for theft and damage to the IRBs, surf boats and quad bike, were maintained. The surf boats, IRBs and motors were insured through brokers Jardine Lloyd Thompson Pty Ltd who manage insurance for many other surf clubs.

Prior to renewal of fire and burglary policy for general contents and a policy covering the quad bike a quote was obtained from Jardine Lloyd Thompson Pty Ltd and given the cheaper rate and similar coverage, two new policies were taken out through this broker.

Public liability insurance to an amount of \$20m was effected through a policy maintained by SLS NSW, the cost being covered by a part of a contribution of \$12.00 (plus GST) per member payable as a levy to SLS NSW.

Directors and Officers Insurance was effected through a policy also maintained by SLS NSW at a cost of \$450.00 (plus GST).

Members continue to be covered by NSW Government Emergency and Rescue Workers Compensation Fund for medical and hospital expenses incurred as a result of an injury whilst involved in an approved surf club activity. The fund also re-imburses members who become incapacitated and unfit for work as a result of an injury, for loss of wages for a limited period.

Louise Anger again promoted and organised the Annual Collection Day held on Saturday 10 November 2007.

A total of \$6,927.00 was raised over a couple of hours under Louise's guidance and with the assistance of Club members who "door-knocked" houses in Helensburgh, Otford, Stanwell Tops and Stanwell Park. Special thanks to Louise and thank you to all who assisted. It was pleasing to see greater participation of our members this year.

The generosity and support of local residents and shopkeepers who contributed to this appeal is acknowledged with thanks.

Trivia Night, fund raising for competitors

Katrina Thompson, Karen Burke, Sue Bell and Bronwyn Wallace together with assistance from others organised a "Bottle Top" Trivia Night (using questions from inside Carlton beer bottle tops) at Helensburgh Workmens Club on Saturday 3 November 2007.

Together with entry fees, auctions and "paying for answers to questions", plus a 200 club run later in the year, \$4,685.00 was raised. Each competitor participating in the State Championships was provided with a subsidy of \$100.00 and those participating in the Australian Championships a further subsidy of \$100.00.

Thank you to all who participated in this fund raising venture.

Stanwell Park Ocean Swim

The Club Executive again extends its thanks to Andrew Perrin and the Ocean Swim organising committee of Wayne Johnston, Kevin Keane and Murray Dowling, and Ken Newman from Coalcliff SLSC.

Thank you to the many Club members who assisted in organisation and running of the event, with particular mention of Sue Bell who co-ordinated the food sales.

Thanks to Coalcliff SLSC members for their involvement, and for joining with our Club to make this a great community event; the support of SLSI and the assistance of Jeff Venning and Gerald Davies is also acknowledged.

The operational and risk management plan prepared for the 2005 event was reviewed during the year and updated to improve some procedures. A new time recording system was introduced this year.

The 2008 event took place in good weather conditions with 285 competitors entered. Cash prizes were offered for the first male and female swimmers over the line, and embroidered towels to winners in other categories, thanks to the support of MBF Travel.

\$5,000.00 was raised from this event and similar to previous years was allocated to the Club Building Account.

Donation and Grant applications for rescue equipment

- √ Application was made to Clubs NSW for a further grant of \$9,500.00 under CDSE funding to purchase a replacement IRB in April 2007. Advice was received in August 2007 that the application had been declined.
- √ A further application was made to Clubs NSW for a grant of \$9,800.00 under CDSE funding to purchase a replacement IRB on 27 March 2008. The result of this application had not been announced at the date of this report.
- √ Application was made for a \$for\$ grant from the Department of Sport and Recreation to purchase a Yamaha Rhino 660 ATV (total cost \$13,540.00) Advice was received on 18 July 2008 that the application had been declined but that a further round of grants may be made in August 2008.
- √ Application was made for a \$for\$ grant from the Telstra Assistance Fund to purchase a Yamaha Rhino 660 ATV (total cost \$13,540.00). The result of this application had not been announced at the date of this report.
- √ Application was made to NRMA Insurance for a grant of \$3,750.00 to purchase three rescue boards. Advice was received on 6 June 2008 that the application had been unsuccessful.

Club building

At the end of the year, some of the work commenced in 2006/07 still required finishing touches to complete. This included the bar area, but was deferred pending receipt and installation of a new "second hand" glass washer donated by Helensburgh Workers Club.

Some work remained to be completed in the Patrol Room.

The PA system was upgraded and external speakers installed by Paul Potter. With "roving mikes" and external speakers, the loud hailer on Sunday mornings for Juniors is a thing of the past, and have also proven suitable for use on the Ocean Swim day,

The two door "drink fridge" that has provided cold beer for members, and which was purchased second hand 25 years ago finally died last November, and was replaced with two reconditioned drink fridges.

In addition for the first time, the kitchen has a new two door fridge/freezer, probably the first time in the history of the Club that a new fridge has been available. This was made possible by a grant from the Commonwealth Government.

The condition of the awning over the stairway and patio was referred to Wollongong City Council as an item for repair in the maintenance program submitted in February 2007. Council responded that repair of this item was not its responsibility, although records held by the Club show that Council shared the cost with the Club when first erected back in the mid-1980s. Further negotiations are intended with Council on this matter.

Some minor maintenance works were still outstanding at the end of the year, and will be referred to Council again prior to commencement of the 2008/09 season.

The Club building was officially opened 22 years ago, and internally it needs some tender loving care and repainting of doors and timber work.

Whilst it might look a little drab, it is however clean and tidy and all members should acknowledge the efforts put in by Peter and Sandra McDonald on a weekly basis to keep the main hall, kitchen and amenities presentable. Thank you Peter and Sandra, your assistance was again very much appreciated.

Extensions to the Club building

During 2006, Wollongong City Council in an endeavour to address OH&S issues for its lifeguards, sought permission for lifeguards to use the Club's kitchen. Council was advised Club members were not in favour of this and have since the lifeguards room to allow preparation of meals, with lifeguards now using the Club patrol room for meals and general observation of the beach.

Further discussions took place with Council officers during the past year, with Council seeking storage options to allow removal of the container and the Club seeking to additional storage space and the opportunity to integrate this with a deck across the southern face of the building.

One option discussed was extension to the north-east of the current building. Some positive discussions took place with Council's planning officers on this concept but there was no discussion on funding or any program to proceed. In the absence of a formal response from Council it can only be reported there have been no further developments towards the provision of additional storage for either Council or the Club.

The Management Committee is aware of grants and \$for\$ opportunities that can be obtained for building work on surf clubs but the stage has not been reached where the Club is in a position to proceed. Funds held in the building account are insufficient to proceed with any project at this time.

As previously stated, the Club needs to find a member prepared to take on a "project manager role" to work with the Executive and oversee the design, preparation of plans and specifications, obtain cost estimates for the work, and pursue the necessary approvals in readiness for lodgement of an application when invitations for further government grants are invited mid-2009.

Strategic Planning and Organisational Review

During August 2006, a representative cross section of 15 members participated in a workshop to consider changes to the Club structure and start on the development of a five year plan.

Proposals were put to members at the 2007 Annual General Meeting to alter the structure of the Management Committee so that it was more representative of all parts of the Club. Whilst members endorsed this concept in principle, most agreed the majority of the officers on the Management Committee should be representative of the patrolling members to

ensure the Club stayed focussed on its primary objective of surf life saving.

With priorities focussed on major events for the 100th year, changes to the proposed structure of the Management Committee were not progressed.

No progress was made on development of a strategic plan. However SLSI invited the Club to become involved in development of a Club Management Plan and the first stage of this was completed in June 2008. Further development will take place with the assistance of SLSI with involvement of the newly elected Management Committee.

Inter-Club Carnival and Championships Report

This year was another successful one for the beachies and Masters competitors with plenty of Branch, State and Australian medals being won. One of the main highlights was Damien Cook being picked as the U/17 representative in the NSW State team. Other highlights from this season included:

Ocean Assault Series: Laura Humphries travelled to Queensland on a number of occasions to compete in the very prestigious Ocean Assault Series. The series comprised of four qualifying carnivals in which competitors accrued points to eventually make the final eight in each event. In the final series, the placegetters received prize money of up to \$3000.

Laura was just pipped by these two girls but this was a huge achievement to gain 3rd place in the final. The determination that Laura showed throughout this series is commendable and she showed those bigger Queensland clubs just what a Helensburgh-Stanwell Park girl can do!

Branch Championships: With only a small beach team in attendance, Damien Cook provided the highlights with a dominant display on the beach. Damien took the flags and sprint double in the U/17's and then backed this up by winning the flags and sprint double in the Open's. Damien proved too strong for his older brother Simon as they tussled their way through the final.

Sue Bell, Kevin Morton, Klaus Dieter-Liss, Peter Burke and Karen Burke showed that age is only a number by claiming some great results in the Masters category at the Championships.

State Titles

Sue Bell got us off to a great start with a dominant performance in her age category in the Masters events. Sue showed her skills in the surf as she cleaned up once again with gold in the surf race, board and ironwoman.

Klaus Dieter-Liss and Peter Burke also made the finals of the sprint and the flags.

The senior beach team travelled to Swansea-Belmont to take on the best that NSW had to offer. Our small team took it to the bigger clubs and we came back with some fantastic results. On day one, Amanda Mercer showed that she has still got it when she picked up a bronze medal in the U/19 Girls Beach Flags.

This was then followed up on day two with an extraordinary run by four of our top female runners – Laura Humphries, Allira Mercer, Chenay Mercer and Laura Mercer who blitzed some of the stronger NSW clubs to finish a close 2nd to Queenscliff in the Open Women's Beach Relay. The girls showed their relay experience with some great changes and some lightning quick runs.

With the girls being so dominant in getting the results, it was left to the ever reliable Damien Cook to make it up for the boys. Damien showed why he is one of the most talented beach flaggers in Australia with a dominant display in the U/17's Men's Beach Flags. Damien showed the boys how it was done and later that afternoon, he showed the men how it was done when he completed the flags double by winning the Open Men's Beach Flags. Separate financial accounts were maintained for the four sections of the Club – General Account, Trading Account (refreshment sales), Junior Activities Account and Winter Swimming Group Account, with each being managed by the elected treasurer of each section and under the overall control of the Management Committee through the Treasurer.

All accounts were computer based, but not on a common financial accounting program. All accounts are presented in this report as GST exclusive amounts.

Financial Position

At the end of the financial year, 31 May 2008, the Club was not in debt to any supplier (other than within 30 day trading terms), and was in a financially sound position. Having reviewed the accounts, the Executive Committee is of the opinion that the Club will be able to pay all debts as and when they fall due.

Indicative quotations of \$35,000 to \$40,000 were received during 2007 to produce and print the Club's Centenary History Book, and the Executive Committee will consider options to fund the book later this year. The Committee confirms it will not enter into a loan or any financial arrangement with an external party without prior endorsement of members.

General Account: the year end balance was around \$7,000 lower than usual. The balance includes income of \$1,218.17 received in advance (for 2008-09).

At 31 May 2008, unpaid invoices totalled \$479.00, all being amounts payable by members for fees or reimbursement of amounts paid on their behalf.

Trading Account: all surplus funds received to year end (\$4,000.00) were transferred, 50% to the General Account and 50% to the Building Account.

Junior section: major income was from clothing sales and Sunday morning canteen sales. At year end an amount of \$1,435.00 was outstanding from members being re-imbursement for carnival entry fees paid by the Club.

Winter Swimming section: finished the year with a loss of \$370.91. However saleable stock on hand of \$1,110.00 more than exceeds the deficit, and once stock is sold, the account will be in order.

Donations and fund raising

Donations made to the Club were separately identified in the financial accounts to comply with requirements of the *Charitable Fundraising Act, 1991*.

The authority held by SLS NSW to fund raise under this Act, CFN 11033, was renewed from 6 May 2004, is current to 5 May 2009, and specifically notes Helensburgh-Stanwell Park SLSC (and other Clubs) as a "branch" of SLS NSW.

All donated funds were expended for the purpose for which they were sought, this being primarily for surf life saving rescue and training activities, other than for the following exceptions –

- donations made to the Winter Swimming section which were specifically sought for CRAM House.
- donations made to the Club which were specifically sought for the purchase and operation of the surf boats.
- a donation made to the Club which was specifically sought to transport competitive equipment to Perth for the Australian Championships.
- fund raising activities (Trivia night and 200 Club) which were specifically identified as being to assist competitors attending the State and Australian championships.
- a fund raising activity which was specifically identified as being to assist a Club member to attend the World championships in Germany.

No member of the Club was entitled to or gained any personal benefits from any donations received.

GST reporting

Quarterly reports were submitted by the Public Officer to the Australian Taxation Office for the Club as a single entity reporting body, but incorporating the four sections (or operating accounts) of the Club.

A review undertaken by the Public Officer, Treasurer and Auditor confirmed that GST was correctly added to income, other than GST free income, and that claims made for a refund where GST had been paid by the Club, were correct. At 30 June 2008, the Club was not in debt to the ATO, and there were no outstanding GST reports.

Auditor

SLS NSW advised during July 2008 that to ensure compliance with the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991*, the Club will be required to engage a registered company auditor, primarily because of the value of assets held. Advice has been sought from SLS NSW as to whether the 2007-08 accounts will require to be re-audited in view of the SLS NSW direction.
