## LIFE SAVING AND PATROLS

Nine patrols were formed again this season, most with seven or eight members. Patrol captains were Gary George, Kevin Morton, Mark Ryan, Mark Thompson, Chris Emmett, Phil Doran, Graham Mercer, Mark Wallace and Tony Van Zyl.

Six members were granted Active Reserve status, and a small number of members were permitted to undertake roving patrols because of difficulties they would have experienced in meeting regular rostered patrols. At the end of the patrolling season, there was a total of 84 active members.

Patrol captains and senior club officers were again appointed as Honorary Beach Inspectors by the Wollongong City Council. No untoward incidents were reported with the exception of a few hang glider pilots landing on the beach early in the season. With the co-operation of Stanwell Park Hang Gliding Club, this problem was quickly overcome.

Throughout the patrol season, only 11 rescues were recorded, with the I.R.B. being used to effect six of these. It is obvious that the actions of patrol members in taking preventative measures and directing swimmers to safer parts of the beach (recorded as 545 persons) has been responsible for the small number of rescues.

There were no persons requiring resuscitation; 21 incidents were recorded where attention was given for stings, first aid treatment, etc.

A commendation was received from the Illawarra Region Helicopter Rescue Service as a result of an incident on Easter Sunday when the chopper was called to assist in the rescue of an injured boardrider from behind the heavy surf break. The commendation was for the competent manner in which the patrol effectively secured a beach landing area, and for ensuring the general safety around the aircraft whilst it was on the beach. Congratulations to Tony Van Zyl and the members of his patrol for their efforts on this day.

A special mention and recognition must be made of the efforts of Meikle Watts, a member of Tony's patrol that afternoon. Prior to the helicopter being summoned to Stanwell Park, efforts had been made to reach the boardrider but the I.R.B. as well as members on rescue boards, had not been able to negotiate the heavy shore break. One of the patrol members however, attempted a belt swim. Making slow progress in the heavy surf, Meikle discarded the belt and continued her swim to the patient, with whom she remained until the arrival of the helicopter. Congratulations Meikle for your part in a difficult rescue.

## CLUB EQUIPMENT

During the season, the club's first I.R.B., the Alex McKenzie, was sold after having been a part of the club since November 1977.

A new I.R.B. motor was acquired early in the season to replace a two year old motor. A new aluminium framed I.R.B. trailer was donated to the club during the year.

Donations this year were also made by way of competitive equipment, with a double ski and three single skis. A single ski was badly damaged during the year and was disposed of.

As a result of controls on the use of competitive equipment introduced last season and continued this year, less damage is occurring to competition craft.

All club equipment has been maintained in a satisfactory condition during the year, and all life saving and rescue equipment has been readily available for use.

The club was congratulated for the manner in which club equipment was presented for inspection at the Branch Gear Inspection prior to the start of the season.

The Jack Mawson First Aid Room was kept in an exceptionally good condition, this being much easier now it is not being used also as the patrol room. Ample supplies of first aid equipment were maintained throughout the year.



## CARNIVALS AND COMPETITION

On behalf of the Club and the competitors, I would like to thank the anonymous donor who provided the new double ski, valued at \$1,000.00; it was much appreciated.

Results at surf carnivals during the year were very good considering that the club had only 12 regular competitors, an increase on last season thanks to the enthusiasm shown by the beach competitors. Brothers Ron, Don and Peter Burke, along with Mark Thompson, Michael Bodor, Matthew Larkin, Peter Phillips and Steve Sruhan, were the main stays in beach events.

The beach relay team made the semi-finals at the Australian Championships, a top performance for their first season in competition.

Our craft competitors are to be congratulated, winning many individual and team events. It is pleasing to hear Stanwell Park S.L.S.C. getting a mention at State, Australian and Sydney carnivals, putting the club back on the map.

Three competitors from our club were selected in the Illawarra Branch team. They were Brett Mitchell, Paul Hobby and Brian Morton. We also had two competitors in the Illawarra Junior Inter-Branch team, Paul Hobby and Brian Morton.

Brian had a good season on the ski, winning the State Cadet Single Ski race at Byron Bay. He also won the State Stillwater Championships and at the Branch had a win in the Single Ski, finished 2nd in the Cadet Run Swim Run, and 3rd in the Malibu Board race. However, at the Australian Championships at Point Leo in Victoria, it wasn't Brian's day. After winning his heats and semi-final, he finished 4th in the final, the first time out of a place for the whole season.

Chris McKay put in a top effort to finish 6th in the Cadet Single Ski at the State Championships.

John Boyle and Paul Hobby made the semi-finals in the Junior Single Ski, and Ron and Don Burke made the semis in the Beach Sprint.

Paul Hobby is one of our top competitors winning many ski races throughout the season. His consistent wins and placings enabled him to take out the well contested Carnival Point Score this year. Paul had a day to remember at the Branch Championships when he won the Junior Single Ski, Open Wave Ski, Junior Wave Ski, and teamed with John Boyle to win the Junior Double Ski; he was unlucky not to win the Open Double Ski partnered with Kevin Morton.

Paul teamed with John Boyle and Kevin Morton for 2nd in the Open Ski Relay and 3rd in the Junior Ski Relay with Peter Phillips and John Boyle.

Brett Mitchell swam at the Branch for a 2nd in the Open Surf and won the Open Belt, a top effort considering lack of competition during the season because of work commitments.

First year Junior John Boyle paddled well gaining a lot of experience with one win and four placings in ski events at the Branch. I tip John to do very well next season.

Cadet Chris McKay a newcomer to competition in craft this season, performed well, rarely finishing out of a place. In the Branch Chris finished 2nd in the Cadet Single Ski, and 6th in the State Championships. He made the semi-final in the Australian titles.

Marina Wood won the Ladies Beach Sprint from a very strong field.

Cadet Steven Sruhan won the Cadet Beach Sprint at the Branch and performed well at all carnivals.

Graham Mercer again won the Open Flags at the Branch. However, work commitments kept Graham out of competition for most of the season.

Many other placings were recorded at the Branch Championships in team events. They included the Cadet Run-Swim-Board Relay (2nd), the Cadet Beach Relay (2nd), Open Ski Relay (2nd) and Junior Ski Relay (3rd), and two Open Beach Relay teams took out 2nd and 3rd placings.

Other individual placings at the Branch were Peter Phillips, 3rd in the Junior Flags, and Kevin Morton, 2nd in the Open Wave Ski.

Congratulations to the two successful board riders who qualified in the Southern Zone to compete at the State Championships. They were Brett Daintry and Paul Dreghorn.

## SOCIAL AND OTHER ACTIVITIES

The 3rd Annual Burgh to Beach Fun Run was held on Sunday, 12th August 1984. Again our major sponsor was the United Permanent Building Society.

The Fun Run has now become a regular event in the club's calendar and as well a part of the local community. Whilst the club raises a substantial amount from the Run, (approximately \$1400.00 with entry fees, food and drink sales), it also requires a tremendous effort in prior organisation, and special credit is due to Terry Daintry in this regard.

The Fun Run would not be possible without the assistance of Terry and many other club members who give of their best to make it a success, and to all helpers the club says thanks.

The event would not run smooth without the help of the WHEELS Running Club, and we would not obtain Police and Council permission to conduct the Run without the assistance of the local Bush Fire Brigade members who act as road marshalls on the day. We would not attract entries if it was not for the promotion and media coverage given so freely by Radio 2WL, by WIN Channel 4, and by the Wollongong Northern News. Our thanks to all of these organisations for their assistance, and also to the Helensburgh Bus Company for the use of their bus, the St. John Ambulance Brigade for providing first aid officers and to Pacific Film Laboratories for printing of chest numbers.

## CLUB ADMINISTRATION

The three sub-committees formed during the previous season did not function as such in 1984/85 and the administration of the club progressed under the control of a management committee as in earlier seasons.

10 Committee meetings were held during 1984/85, with attendances averaging only about 9 or 10 members.

Since the election of office bearers at the A.G.M., the following changes have taken place:

Chief Instructor - Michael Keating elected at meeting on 27th August 1984; resigned 8th January 1985.

Public Relations Officer - T. Daintry elected at meeting on 27th August 1984.

Publicity Officer - H. Dreghorn elected at meeting on 27th August 1984.

G. Wood - to take over duties of Chief Instructor as from 8th January 1985.

The club was again affiliated with the Illawarra Branch of the S.L.S.A., and every effort has been made to maintain a satisfactory relationship with that body. Again the club was well represented at Branch meetings and seminars and club members continue to serve at Branch level, with the most notable being Bobo White as District Supervisor. Other members serving on the Board of Examiners are Con Asmussen, Jeff Lucke, and probationary members Graham Cook and Mark Ryan.

The club's involvement with the Junior Association - the Seagulls - has continued at a high level, and the juniors have continued to operate as an integrated unit of our club. For ease of administration however, the Seagulls have continued to maintain their own committee, records and finances. A report from the Seagulls is included in the Annual Report.

Congratulations to the Executive and Committee of the Seagulls for their great efforts this season with the young lifesavers - the report from President Mike Dezius tells it all.

The club has provided water safety as required for the Seagulls, for Sunday morning point scores, and for their carnival. In return we acknowledge the continuing assistance that has been forthcoming from the Seagulls in fund raising and other activities.

Congratulations to Evan Griffiths on his election as a Life Member of our club at the 1984 Annual General Meeting.

A special thanks to Lance and Barbara Morton for their assistance during the season with carnival entries. With the increasing number of regular competitors now in the club, and the increasing requirements by the Association in respect to the completion of carnival entries, the compilation of entries takes some time.

Again a big problem in the club has been a lack of finance. A quick perusal of the financial statements might suggest this is due to large expenditure on the new building, but this is not the case. In fact the building account up to now has been self supporting; only funds specially allocated for the building account ('Brick' purchases, the Fun Run entry fees, the Government Grant, etc) have been used to meet expenditure on the building. At the end of the season, the building account had a credit balance of almost \$200.00.

Despite some large fund raising activities, including Lifesavers Appeal Day and the Christmas 200 Club, plus donations towards the purchase of competitive equipment, the club is not making any financial headway. We finished the previous season with \$114.00 in the bank, this year we are only \$50.00 better off. However, there has been virtually no replacement or renewal of life saving/rescue equipment during the year (except one IRB motor) and there has been no funds allocated in reserve for the replacement of any equipment next season. This can only be regarded as a critical situation which the incoming Executive and Committee will need to address early in the new season.

Our community relationship during the season was excellent with two major projects. Firstly the club's involvement and participation in the Helensburgh Centenary Celebrations served to confirm to the older residents the inter-relationship between the past history of the township of Helensburgh and the surf club, and at the same time, it highlighted the community value of the surf life saving movement in today's life style.

The second project came in the guise of the Country Woman of the Year Quest, when Stanwell Park C.W.A. selected the surf club as the group it would assist. Through some combined fund raising efforts with the C.W.A., a total of \$1,030.00 was raised, with half of this coming to the surf club and the other 50% remaining with the C.W.A.

Stanwell park C.W.A. entrant Carol Pugh won the award for the highest amount raised in the Illawarra group.

Publicity of the club's activities was arranged during the year through the Wollongong Northern News. This is another area of the club where there is a deficiency. An energetic Publicity Officer, who can provide regular promotion of the club's activities for the benefit of the public, and in generally communicating with club members about club activities, is needed. Another item to be addressed early in the new season.

There were very few social functions during the year, and this is a further area that needs to be looked into - social functions are necessary to keep the members together as well as for fund raising.

## THE NEW CLUB HOUSE

With the \$10,000 Grant from the State Government, which was obtained through State Centre SLSA in the 1983/84 season, a great deal of progress has been made towards completing the inside of the new part of the club house. The grant was used mainly for the purchase of equipment - interior linings, lights, bricks, floor tiles, plumbing and drainage items, etc. - as well as some labour costs.

A further \$4,000.00 has been made available to the club on loan and has been used to pay for labour to fix the interior linings, ceiling, etc. and to purchase other odds and ends that have been required.

At the end of May 1985, the interior lining (plasterboard) was completed, most electrical work was completed, and the toilets and kitchen have been formed up and floor tiles laid. Plumbing and drainage work is nearing completion. Interior doors have been fitted. Interior linings for the office and gym area on the 2nd level were donated, as well as a donation of Super-grass for the new patrol room.

In addition to a small contingent of dedicated active members who have worked on the building, there have been a number of tradesmen who have helped, most at little or no charge. Some of these include Frank Krinks, Klaus Herrmann, Ray Rankin, Alan Hanna, Dave Cooper, Bill Ryan and Wal Powell. These are by no means all of the people who have helped but it is felt they deserve some special mention because of their ever-ready and willing assistance.

Although the Building Account has continued to grow during the year with a few more 'Brick' purchases, all available funds were ploughed back into the building as fast as received.

## OLD BOYS REPORT

The 16th Annual 'Old Boys' Re-union was held at the usual location, the Helensburgh Workmens Club on Sunday, 21st October 1984. Unfortunately, organising committeeman Ken Bridle was unable to be present owing to hospitalisation.

Mr Robert Tickner, M.P., member for the Federal Electorate of Hughes, was warmly received at his first attendance at this function.

The occasion was especially enjoyable as it coincided with the 'Old Timers' dinner, a function which included many senior residents of Helensburgh, and an event that was part of the official Centenary Celebrations of the township of Helensburgh. It afforded an opportunity for the older members and ex-members of the surf club to renew acquaintances with the older citizens of Helensburgh, relatives of whom contributed to the membership of the Helensburgh - Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving Club at its formation in 1908.


