The only sad thing, as I reflect over the past season, was our first official drowning in 78 years of surf life saving. To all the members involved in the rescue attempt, the Club says well done on your efforts. Our record of only one loss of life in the 78 years of patrols is still outstanding.

Congratulations to the winners of the 1985/86 Patrol Competition. Patrol 2 sponsored by Modern Motor. The patrol consisted of Captain Mark Ryan, Keith Stoddart, Chris Powell, Clive Collins, Peter Phillips, and Jason and James Powell. A note of thanks to Clarrie Whitten on the success of the Patrol Competition this season. Thanks Clarrie for a great job.

A special mention of Patrol Member of the Year, Ron Burke. Ron completed 22 patrols, a total of 88 hours. A big achievement for a fellow only in his 3rd season in the Club. Well done Ron, I wish we had another 80 members like you.

In competition, the Club experienced its greatest success at the State Championships. To all the members who competed, winners and losers, a top effort and we hope to see you again next season doing the Park cap proud.

Club competition was again pushed around the calendar with Mark Thompson "once again doing a fantastic job," although finding it hard to secure a Sunday with good weather and free of carnivals. Once the competitions were organised and run, the championships were well contested with close finishes.

The awards side did not go as well due to the shortage of instructors, but to the few devoted instructors we do have, thank you. To the new members who gained their awards, congratulations and welcome to the club.

Finally thanks to Zorba for his efforts and assistance as Vice Captain; you really thrive in the position, Rick.

LIFE SAVING AND PATROLS

Nine patrols were formed this season under patrol captains Kevin Morton, Mark Ryan, Chris Emmett, Mark Wallace, Mark Thompson, Phil Doran, Tony Van Zyl, Gary George and Gary Chapman.

There were 76 active patrol members and one member applied for and was granted Active Reserve status. 3 members were allowed to undertake roving patrols because of their work commitments.

All patrol captains and other senior club officers were appointed as Honorary Beach Inspectors by the Wollongong City Council.

On Saturday, 1st February 1986, whilst Council beach inspectors supported by a four member Club patrol, were on duty, a drowning occurred. The Club log book records the incident as follows -

'1 fatality-a middle aged gent was brought out of the water; resuscitated for approx. 45-50 minutes. Ambulance called immediately. No response. Doctor on hand pronounced patient dead.'

On Sunday, 16th February 1986 during beach patrols, Ron Burke then operating the I.R.B. was injured when the swivel arm bracket on the IRB motor fractured with loss of rudder control of the boat.

There were no other serious incidents reported. A total of 31 rescues were effected, 12 with the I.R.B. Again a large number of persons (recorded as 1187) were warned to swim within the patrolled area, or were guided to more safe swimming areas.

144 incidents of marine stings (mostly blue bottles) were recorded as well as 13 other first aid cases.

During the season, 7 club members attended a Board of Examiners Congress organised by State Centre, at Narrabeen Lakes. These members were Ron Burke, Don Burke, Rick Dzopalic, Matt Markin, Michael Bodor, and current Board of Examiner members Jeff Lucke and Bobo White.

In accordance with Association rules, active patrol members are required to complete a Proficiency test each season; only 9 active members failed to present themselves for the test this season, and as such completed the season as radio officers and observers.

During the season, three commendations were received as a result of special efforts by club members.

On 15th December 1985, an emergency situation occurred at Garie beach when a member of the public suffered a near fatal cardiac arrest. Because of poor radio reception it was necessary for messages to be relayed through Stanwell Park base, and the radio operator for the afternoon, Glen Brown, remained and carried out his duties well beyond the finish of rostered patrol hours.

In extending thanks for the Club's efforts, Garie SLSC wrote "...The expediency and efficiency with which the messages were relayed were exemplary and very much appreciated by this club and I expect, ultimately, by the patient."

On Sunday, 16th February 1986 our Club was required to man the Branch Radio Base, then located at Bellambi Surf Club, as part of a new scheme that each club is rostered in turn to man the base. In commenting on the difficulties experienced by Scott Daintry on that day at Bellambi surf club, the Secretary of the Illawarra Branch wrote "...rather unusual and dubious circumstances were encountered on the day at Bellambi. Scott is to be commended in undertaking the task presented him in a conscientious and reliable manner. ...the participation of Scott as the Branch radio officer is a reflection that the Helensburgh-Stanwell Park S.L.S.C. is certainly meeting their commitment in this regard."

On 12th January 1986 a 10 year old girl was hit by falling rock in a cave at the southern end of the beach; the patient suffered extensive abrasions to the left side of her body and was transported to hospital. Her parents, Les and Susan Johns wrote to express their "...gratitude for the wonderfully efficient and caring manner in which members of your club assisted our daughter Emille on Sunday, 12th January when she had a serious accident on the rocks at the south end of the beach."

The patrol on duty on that day consisted of Mark Thompson, Keith Stoddart, Chris Powell, Clive Collins, Ron Burke as well as a number of other members who were doing voluntary patrols.

Whilst these three incidents have been recorded, there have undoubtedly been other incidents throughout the season where the efforts of club members have been worthy of similar commendation, and to all patrol members, the thanks and appreciation of the Club is extended to you for your own personal efforts towards the surf life saving movement.

CLUB EQUIPMENT

At the commencement of the season, club life saving and competitive equipment was presented for inspection to Branch officials in a very high standard.

All life saving equipment has been maintained in a satisfactory condition during the year, with the exception of the I.R.B. radio which is still under repair.

Repairs to the I.R.B. were effected during the year, mainly in the form of an overhaul and patching to bring it up to satisfactory standard.

Following donation of another IRB trailer this season, the old trailer was sold at cost to Scarborough-Wombarra SLSC.

The Jack Mawson First Aid Room has been maintained in an exceptionally good condition, and has been well stocked with ample first aid supplies.

We gained 5 new drivers and 8 crewpersons, and this season saw the Club gain its first two I.R.B. Examiners (Graham Cook and Mark Ryan).

CARNIVALS AND COMPETITION

The 1985 season has been the most successful one to date. Competitors are to be congratulated on their efforts. They recorded 50 wins, 60 second placings and 42 thirds at surf carnivals. An outstanding effort at the Branch Championships resulted in the Club winning 8 Gold, 6 Silver and 9 Bronze medals.

At the N.S.W. Championships the Club gained 3 Gold Medals and 2 Bronze, the best result Helensburgh - Stanwell Park S.L.S.C. has ever gained at State level. This enabled the Club to finish a close 2nd in the Regional point score, another first for our club.

After a lot of organising and fund raising, the Club managed to send a large touring team to the Australian Championships in Moana, South Australia. The team consisted of 16 competitors, a team manager and four club members who were appointed as carnival officials.

Evergreen Graham Mercer rose to the occasion to take out the Bronze medal at the State and later showed his consistency by gaining the Bronze in the Australian Championships. A good effort considering he did not have much competition until January this season.

First year Junior Brian Morton performed well throughout the season, winning 5 Gold and 1 Silver at the Branch Championships. He also paddled well at the State, winning the Junior Single Ski and partnered with John Boyle to win the Junior Double Ski.

John also had a good season, he won 2 Gold and 2 Silver medals at the Branch Championships. John teamed with Brian to win a Gold medal at the N.S.W. Stillwater Championships at Lake Illawarra.

Kevin Morton has been paddling well, and gained 2 Gold and 1 Silver at the Branch Championships. A good team effort was recorded when Brian Morton, Kevin Morton and Paul Hobby easily won the Open Ski Relay.

Paul also teamed with Kevin to gain 2nd in the Open Double Ski.

In the Open Board Riding, Brett Daintry surfed well to gain 2nd in the Branch Championships, and improved in the State titles to take the Gold medal. Brett also finished 4th in the Australian Championships, a top effort taking into account the flat surfing conditions.

Junior Chris McKay finished 3rd in the Open Board Riding at the Branch Championships and showed his versatility by winning a Gold in the Junior Ski Relay and 3rd in the Junior Wave Ski. A bad draw in the Junior Ski Relay at the State cost Chris another medal. However, I think our team will win this event next season.

Rohan White did well gaining a Bronze at the Branch Board Riding in the Cadet events.

Meikle Watts, our only swimmer at the Australian Championships performed well, finishing 12th in the Ladies Surf Race and 7th in the Ladies Malibu. Meikle won the Ladies Malibu at the Branch after finishing 2nd in

the Ladies Surf race. She paddled well for a 3rd in the State Championships. A top effort, Meikle leads by example as her record in club point score and championships events indicate.

Beach Events

The beach competitors had a top season winning many relays, sprints and flag events. It was quite spectacular to see the Park running in most finals and at times finishing 1st, 2nd and 3rd.

Marina Wood ran well for a 3rd placing in the Ladies beach sprint at the Branch Championships; she was also a competitor at the Australian Championships at Moana.

The Burke brothers, Ron, Don and Peter, along with Matt Larkin made up the relay team which won many races including the Branch Beach Relay, and a 6th in the N.S.W. championships. The 'B' relay team consisted of Mark Thompson, Gary Rankin, Peter Phillips and Mark Warncken. New comer Mark ran well at the Australian Championships and should do well next season.

Matt Larkin sprinted strongly for 3rd in the Branch Championships. In the Open Beach events, Ron and Don Burke fought out many sprints and flag events between them.

Junior Peter Phillips won sprint and flag events throughout the season and finished 6th in the Junior Flags in the N.S.W. Championships and made the semi finals in the Australian Championships.

Improving Cadet Steven McDonald finished 3rd in both Flags and Sprint at the Branch and performed well to make the Flags semi finals at the Australian Championships. Steven also took out a Bronze in the Cadet R & R at the Branch.

However, the degree of co-operation and co-ordination is maintained at a high level, and there can be no doubt that the Seagulls are fully integrated with the Helensburgh - Stanwell Park S.L.S.C.

Throughout the season, the committee of the Seagulls have continued to press their assistance, both financial and in man hours towards the common aims of the Club and on behalf of the Club Executive and Management Committee I would extend appreciation and thanks to Seagulls committee for the work that has been done this season.

I would again this year extend my personal thanks to Lance and Barbara Morton for their continuing assistance with compiling the carnival entries.

The Building Committee has met regularly over the last few months since the announcement of a \$10,000 grant from the State Government.

I would extend my thanks to Assistant Secretary, Anne Dreghorn for her help throughout the year, as well as to other club officers and club members for their co-operation and assistance.
